Analysis of Income & Expenditure of Regional Political Parties for FY 2019-20

Executive Summary

Political parties have multiple sources of funding and thus accountability and transparency should be an important aspect of their functioning. It is essential to have comprehensive and transparent accounting methods and systems which should reveal the true financial position of the parties.

The Election Commission of India (ECI), in its letter dated 19th November, '14 addressed to the Presidents/General Secretaries of all political parties, stated that it was mandatory for the parties to submit details of their audited reports to the Commission. This report analyses the total income and expenditure incurred, all over India, by the **42 Regional Parties** during FY 2019-20, as declared by the parties in their IT Returns submitted to the ECI.

The Regional Parties include BJD, TDP, SHS, DMK, SP, AAP, YSR-C, AIADMK, JDS, TRS, SAD, JDU, AJSU, RJD, JVM-P, IUML, PMK, JMM, SDF, LJP, INLD, RLD, JJP, NDPP, SKM, DMDK, AIMIM, MGP, AIUDF, GFP, AIFB, MNF, NPF, JKPD, KC-M, AGP, ZNP, IPFT, PDA, AINRC, MPC and RLP.

Status of submission of audited reports by the Regional Parties, FY 2019-20

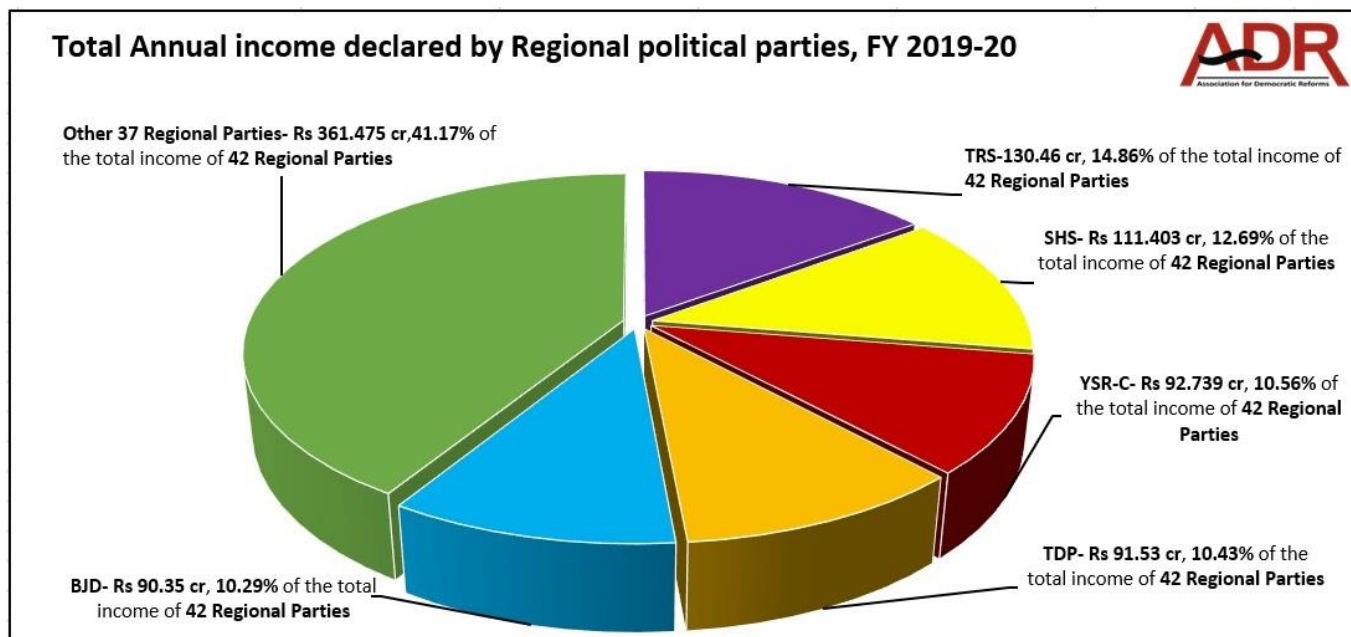
- The due date for submission of annual audited accounts for the parties was **30th June, '21**, which was an extended deadline keeping in view the Covid-19 pandemic.
- 37** parties had submitted their audit reports on time, while 5 parties (NPF, IUML, ZNP, IPFT and KC-M) delayed their submission by several days, ranging from **27 days to 77 days**.
- Audit Reports of the remaining **11** Regional Parties for **FY 2019-20** are unavailable on the website of the ECI at the time of preparation of this report. These include some major political parties like **MNS, JKNPP, RLSP, BPF, JKNC, and PPA** etc.
- Hence, this report analyses the income and expenditure of **42 Regional Political Parties**, whose audit reports are available on the ECI website, for **FY 2019-20**.

Total income declared by Regional Political Parties, FY 2019-20

- The total income of the **42** Regional Parties for the FY 2019-20 was **Rs 877.957 cr.**
- TRS** reported having the highest income of **Rs 130.46 cr**, which forms **14.86%** of the total income of all the parties analysed, followed by **SHS** with an income of **Rs 111.403 cr** or **12.69%** and **YSR-C** whose income was **Rs 92.739 cr** or **10.56%** of the total income of the 42 Regional parties analysed in this report.
- The **total income of top 5 parties** amounted to **Rs 516.482 cr**, which comprised **58.83%** of the total income of the political parties analysed, collectively.



Comparison of Income of Regional Parties, FY 2018-19 and FY 2019-20

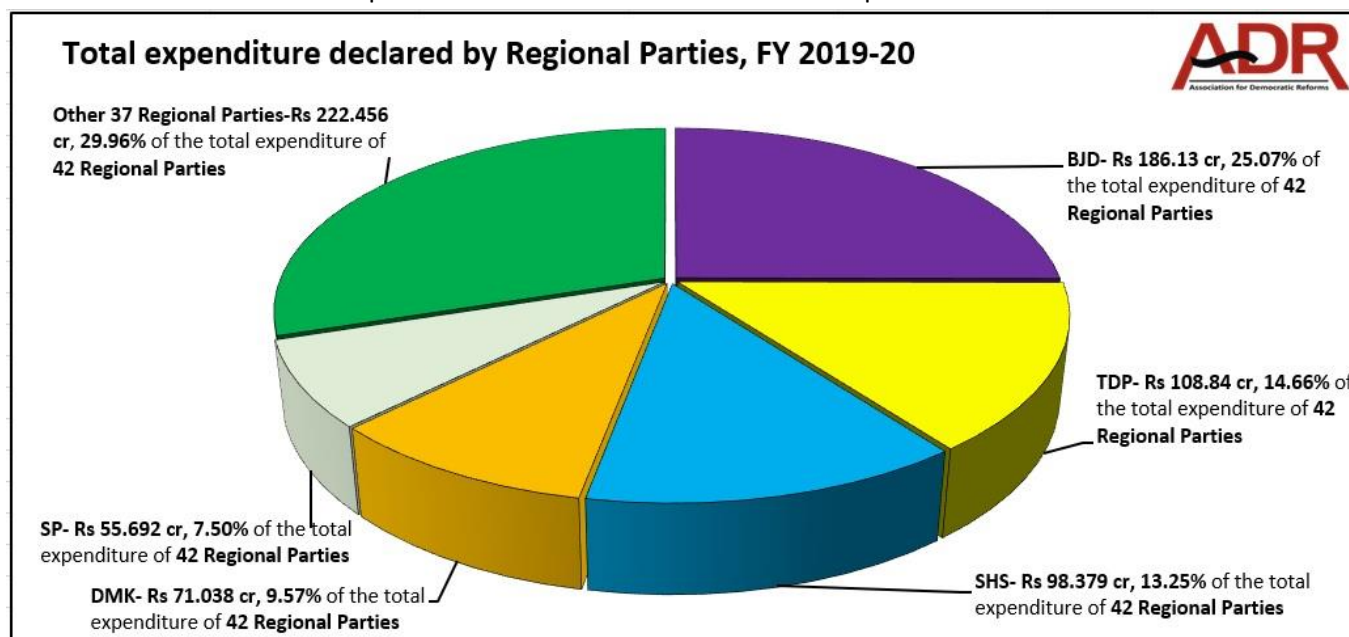
- Out of a total of **39** parties from 42 political parties whose data is available for both the years, **23** parties have shown an **increase in their income** from FY 2018-19 to FY 2019-20 while **16** parties have shown a **decline in their income** during this period.
- Total income of the 39 parties decreased from **Rs 1087.206 cr** in FY 2018-19 to **Rs 874.467 cr** in FY 2019-20, a total decrease of **19.57%** or **Rs 212.739 cr**.
- AIADMK** reported the highest increase in its income of **Rs 61.506 cr** followed by **DMK** and **AAP** which declared a total increase of **Rs 38.557 cr** and **Rs 30.337 cr** respectively, between FY 2018-19 and FY 2019-20.

Unspent Income of Regional Parties, FY 2019-20

- There are **24** Regional parties who declared a part of their **income as remaining unspent** for the FY 2019-20 while **18** political parties **spent more than the income collected** during the year.
- TRS** has more than **83.76%** of its total income remaining unspent while **AIADMK** and **JJP** have **67.82%** and **64%**, respectively, of their income remaining unspent for FY 2019-20.
- TDP, BJD, DMK, SP, JDS, AJSU, JVM-P, INLD, PMK, MGP, GFP, SDF, MNF, AIFB, NPF, JKPDP, IPFT and MPC** are the 18 Regional parties that declared spending more than their income. **BJD** has declared spending highest amount of **Rs 95.78 cr** or **106.01%** more than its income.

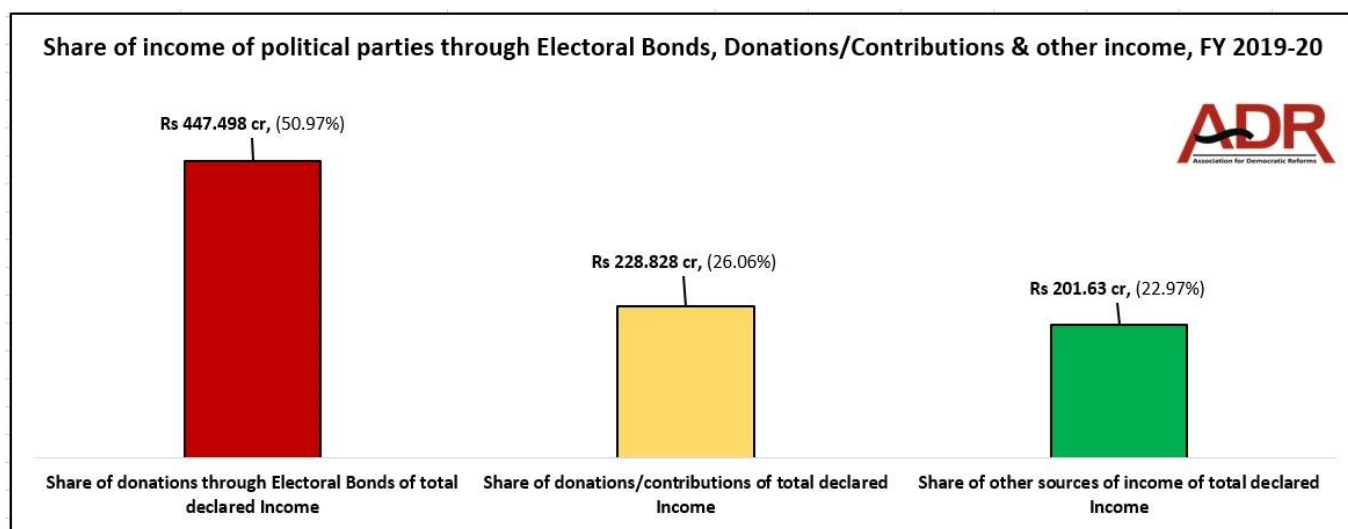
Total expenditure incurred by Regional Parties, FY 2019-20

- The total declared expenditure of the 42 Regional parties for the FY 2019-20 was **Rs 742.535 cr.**
- Total expenditure incurred by the **top 3 parties** is **Rs 393.35 cr** or **52.97%** of the total expenditure as reported by the 42 political parties.
- **Top 5 parties** that have incurred **highest expenditure** are **BJD** which had spent **Rs 186.13 cr** or **25.07%**, followed by **TDP** which spent **Rs 108.84 cr** or **14.66%**, **SHS** which spent **Rs 98.379 cr** or **13.25%**, **DMK** which spent **Rs 71.038 cr** or **9.57%** and **SP** which spent **Rs 55.692 cr** or **7.50%** of the total expenditure.



All sources of Income declared by Regional Political parties, FY 2019-20

- **42 Regional Parties** collected **Rs 676.326 cr** or **77.03%** of their total income from **voluntary contributions** (includes Donations & Contributions and Electoral Bonds) for FY 2019-20.
- Under voluntary contributions, political parties collected **50.97%** or **Rs 447.498 cr** of their income from **Donations through Electoral Bonds** while other Donations & Contributions amounted to **Rs 228.828 cr** or **26.06%** for FY 2019-20.
- Only **14** of the 42 Regional Parties that were analysed declared **donations through Electoral Bonds** amounting to **Rs 447.498 cr.**
- **12.96%** or **Rs 113.761 cr** of the total income was generated through **Interest Income & FDRs** by the 42 Regional Parties during FY 2019-20.



Observations of ADR

- **Audit reports** of 5 parties (NPF, IUML, ZNP, IPFT and KC-M) were available on the ECI website after a **delay of 27 days to 77 days** from the extended deadline.
- The income tax returns/audit reports of **11** Regional Parties are not available on the ECI website at the time of preparation of this report even after **103 days since the due date for submission**.
- Given the **anonymity provided to donors** by the scheme, it is seen that **Electoral Bonds** have emerged as the most **popular mode of donations** to Regional Political parties for FY 2019-20. **More than 50.97%** of the total income (Rs 447.498 cr) of the 42 Regional political parties analysed for FY 2019-20 is received from **Donations through Electoral Bonds**.
- The most common and popular items of expenditure for regional parties for FY 2019-20 are **election expenses/general propaganda and administrative/general expenses**.
- **Janata Dal Secular (JDS)** has declared membership fees and other fees under the Grants/donations/Contributions for the FY 2019-20.
- **IUML** party has declared the income and expenditure details under the heading of FY 2018-19 in its audit report for FY 2019-20. This shows the lackadaisical approach to disclosures/reporting both on the part of the political party and the Election Commission, which uploaded the file without rectification or seeking any clarification from the party.
- **For the FY 2019-20, more than 62% of the total income of seven National Parties came from Donations through Electoral Bonds (Rs 2993.826 cr)**, wherein identity of the donor is not disclosed to the public. Of the Regional parties that have submitted their audit reports, **14 Regional Parties** (TRS, TDP, YSR-C, BJD, DMK, SHS, AAP, JDU, SP, JDS, SAD, AIADMK, RJD & JMM) have **declared receiving donations through Electoral Bonds worth Rs 447.498 cr**, which is **50.97%**.
- As per the data shared by SBI in response to ADR's RTI application, Electoral Bonds worth **Rs 3429.5586 cr** were **redeemed by parties in FY 2019-20**. Of this, **87.29% was received by four National Parties – BJP, INC, AITC & NCP**. The total amount of Electoral Bonds declared by **National and Regional parties for FY 2019-20** so far is **Rs 3441.324 cr**. The **difference in the amount declared by political parties** and data on **Electoral Bonds redeemed** received from SBI could be due to the manner in which parties report in their audit report. For example: AAP declared donations from electoral bonds under the head **"Others (Electoral Bonds/Electoral Trust)"**. It may also be noted that audit reports of many other Regional parties are not yet available in the public domain. Once this data is

available and subsequently if these parties declare receiving donations via Electoral Bonds, the total share of donations received from Electoral Bonds may increase further.

- The most common and popular source of income for the National and Regional Political parties for FY 2019-20 are **Donations through Electoral Bonds**. Electoral Bonds have emerged as the most **popular channel of donations** to parties in the last two years. It is to be noted that **JMM party has declared the name of the donor who donated Rs 1 crore through Electoral Bond in its contribution report for FY 2019-20, however, this income through electoral bonds has not been declared by the party in its audit report, FY 2019-20**. This raises the question as to **whether political parties are aware of the donor's identity who made contributions via electoral bonds**, as can be seen in this case.
- During FY 2019-20 out of the 42 Regional Parties, **JDS, SAD, JVM-P & LJP** declared receiving a total income of **Rs 14.884 cr from Sale of Coupons**.

Recommendations of ADR

- The Supreme Court gave a judgment on September 13, 2013 declaring that no part of a candidate's affidavit should be left blank. Along the same lines, we recommend that the Election Commission of India impose rules that **no part of the Form 24A submitted by political parties providing details of donations above Rs 20,000 should be left blank**.
- Full details of all **donors should be made available for public scrutiny under the RTI**. Some countries where this is done include Bhutan, Nepal, Germany, France, Italy, Brazil, Bulgaria, the US and Japan. In none of these countries is it possible for 75% of the source of funds to be unknown. According to the **Finance Act, 2017**, Section 13A of the IT Act was amended to state that tax exemption will be given to registered political parties *"Provided also that such political party furnishes a return of income for the previous year in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (4B) of section 139 on or before the due date under that section."* Thus, any party which does not submit its IT returns on or before the due date, **their income should not be tax-exempted and defaulting parties should be derecognized**.
- Electoral Bonds infringe the citizen's fundamental 'Right to Know' by withholding crucial information regarding electoral funding. Such opaqueness is at the cost of larger public interest and is a severe blow to the very fundamentals of transparency and accountability. Serious concerns have been raised by civil society as well as constitutional authorities such as EC and RBI that **anonymous donations through Electoral Bonds will encourage money laundering and lead to increased use of black money for political funding through shell companies**. Therefore, **Electoral Bonds Scheme, 2018 should be entirely scrapped**.
- In the case of continuance of the Scheme, **the principle of anonymity of the bond donor** enshrined in the Electoral Bond Scheme, 2018 **must be done away with**. All political parties which receive donations through Electoral Bonds should declare in their Contributions Reports the total amount of such donations received in the given financial year, along with the detailed particulars of the donors as against each Bond; the amount of each such bond and the full particulars of the credit received against each bond. The procedures and reporting framework for the above must be standardized to ensure that a true picture of the financial position of the political parties is revealed to the general public.
- The **ECI/CBDT/CAG or any other relevant institution** should be **entrusted with the responsibility to oversee** that there is **no discrepancy between the value of Electoral Bonds redeemed and the value of donations received through Electoral Bonds by the political parties**, and whether only entitled political parties are receiving funding via Electoral Bonds.
- **All Political parties must provide all information on their finances under the Right to Information Act**. This will only strengthen political parties, elections and democracy.

- Those parties not following the ICAI guidelines for auditing of reports should be scrutinized by the IT department.

Need for a strict mechanism for reporting financial information

To ensure that there is financial transparency and accountability on the part of the political parties, there must be a strict mechanism with respect to reporting of financial information. The procedures and reporting framework must be standardized to ensure that a true picture of the financial position of the political parties is revealed to the general public. Institute of Chartered Accounts of India (ICAI) has put forward a set of recommendations on the request of the Election Commission of India (ECI). These recommendations relate to a standardized and comprehensive reporting framework of financial statements of political parties. ADR feels that there is a dire need for these recommendations to be implemented at the earliest.

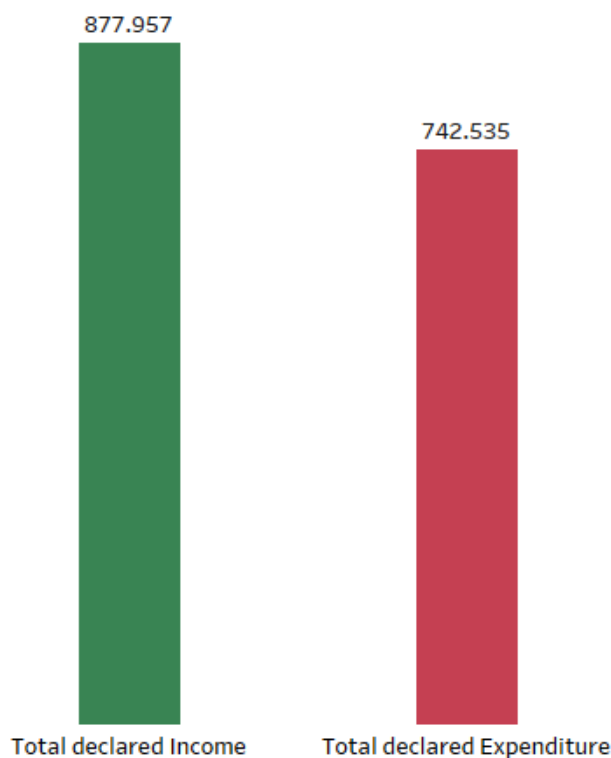
Status of submission of Annual Audit reports by the Regional Parties, FY 2019-20

- The due date for submission of annual audited accounts for the parties was **30th June,'21**, which was an extended deadline keeping in view the **Covid-19 pandemic**.
- 37 of the 42 Regional Parties** had **submitted their audit reports on time** i.e. by **30th June,'21**, while 5 parties (NPF, IUML, ZNP, IPFT and KC-M) delayed their submission by several days, ranging from **27 days to 77 days**.
- 103 days since the due date for submission**, audit reports of the remaining **11 Regional Parties** for **FY 2019-20** are yet to be available on the website of the ECI, at the time of preparation of this report.
- Some of the political parties whose audited statements are yet to be available on the ECI website include major political parties like **MNS, JKNPP, RLSP, BPF, JKNC, and PPA** etc.

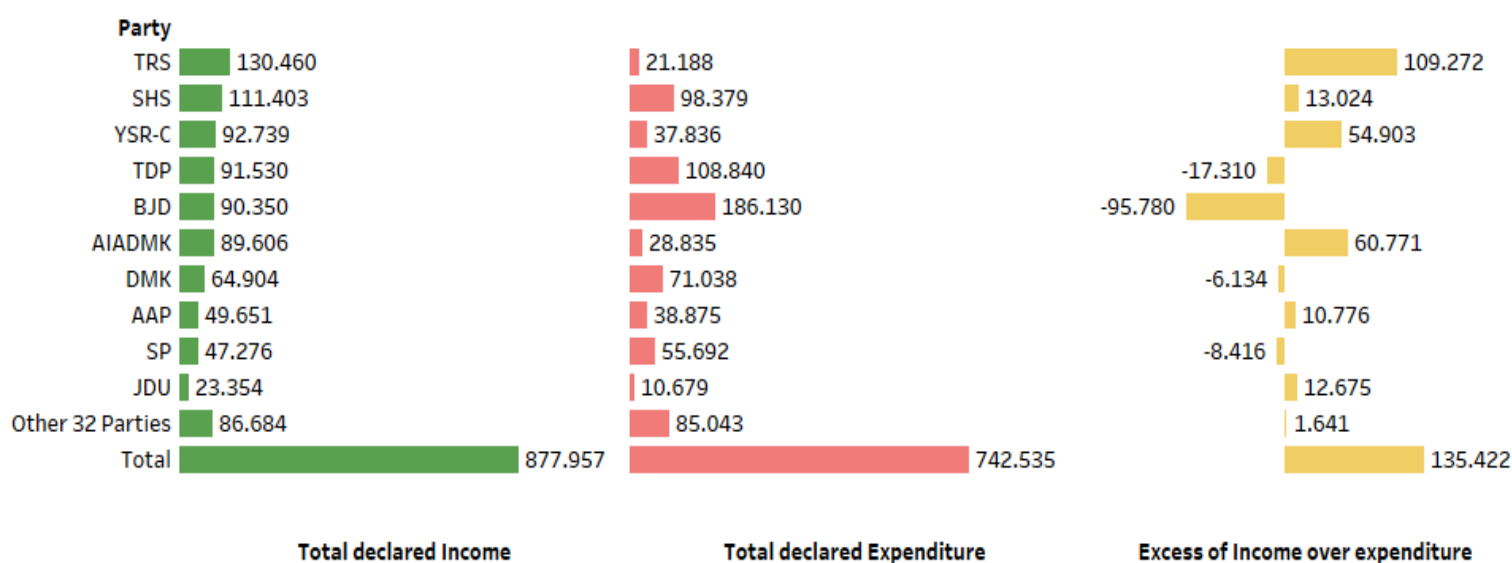
Total Income and Expenditure of Regional Parties, FY 2019-20

- During FY 2019-20, the **total income** declared by **42 Regional Political Parties** was **Rs 877.957 cr** while the total expenditure incurred by these parties amounts to **Rs 742.535 cr**, resulting in **15.42%** of the income **remaining unspent**.
- The top 5 parties with highest total declared income include **TRS, SHS, YSR-C, TDP & BJD**. **TRS** has the highest income of **Rs 130.46 cr** or **14.86%** amongst all the 42 Regional parties whose audit reports are available on the ECI website.
- In terms of the total declared expenditure, **BJD** spent the highest amount of **Rs 186.13 cr** followed by **TDP** and **SHS**, which spent **Rs 108.84 cr** and **Rs 98.379 cr** respectively.
- 18 out of 42 political parties**, which have submitted their audit reports, have **incurred expenditure more than their total income**. Out of these, **BJD, INLD, PMK, SDF, NPF** and **JKPDP** have **spent more than 100% of their total income** during FY 2019-20.
- During FY 2019-20, the **top five political parties with excess of income over expenditure** include **TRS, AIADMK, YSR-C, SHS** and **JDU**. **TRS** has the highest 'excess of income over expenditure' of **Rs 109.272 cr**, followed by **AIADMK** with **Rs 60.77 cr** and **YSR-C** with **Rs 54.903 cr**.

Total Income & Expenditure declared by top 10 Regional Parties, FY 2019-20 (in Rs Cr)

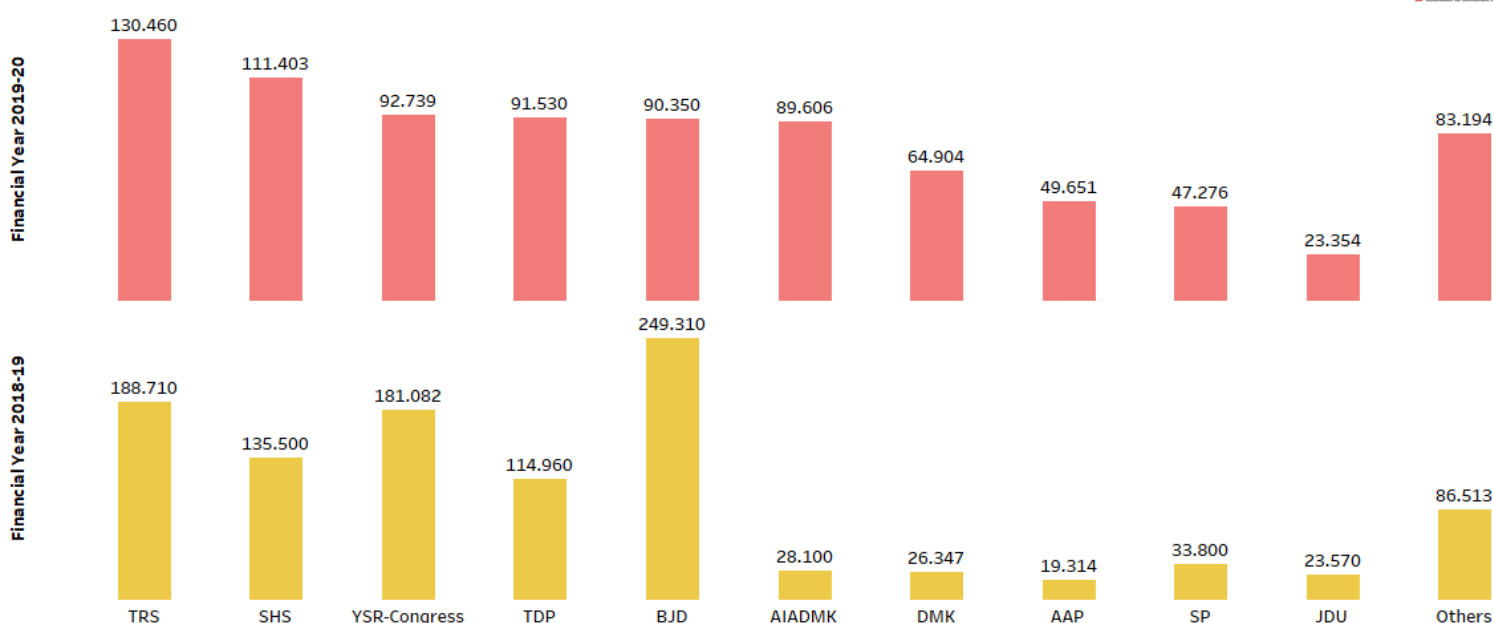

Comparison of Income of Regional Parties, FY 2018-19 and FY 2019-20

- Total income of the 39 out of 42 parties, whose audit reports are available for both FY 2018-19 and 2019-20, decreased from **Rs 1087.206 cr** in FY 2018-19 to **Rs 874.467 cr** in FY 2019-20, a total **decrease of 19.57%** or **Rs 212.739 cr**.
- 23 parties** have shown an **increase in their income** from FY 2018-19 to FY 2019-20 while **16 parties** have shown a **decline in their income** during this period.
- Comparing the income of top 5 parties for FY 2019-20 with the previous financial year, **AIADMK** declared the highest increase in its income of **Rs 61.506 cr** or **218.88%**, followed by **DMK** and **AAP** which declared a total increase of **Rs 38.557 cr** or **146.34%** and **Rs 30.337 cr** or **157%** respectively.
- SDF** declared the maximum **decrease in income** between FY 2018-19 and 2019-20 by **94.64%** followed by **PMK** (**91.13%**) and **NDPP** (**85.91%**).

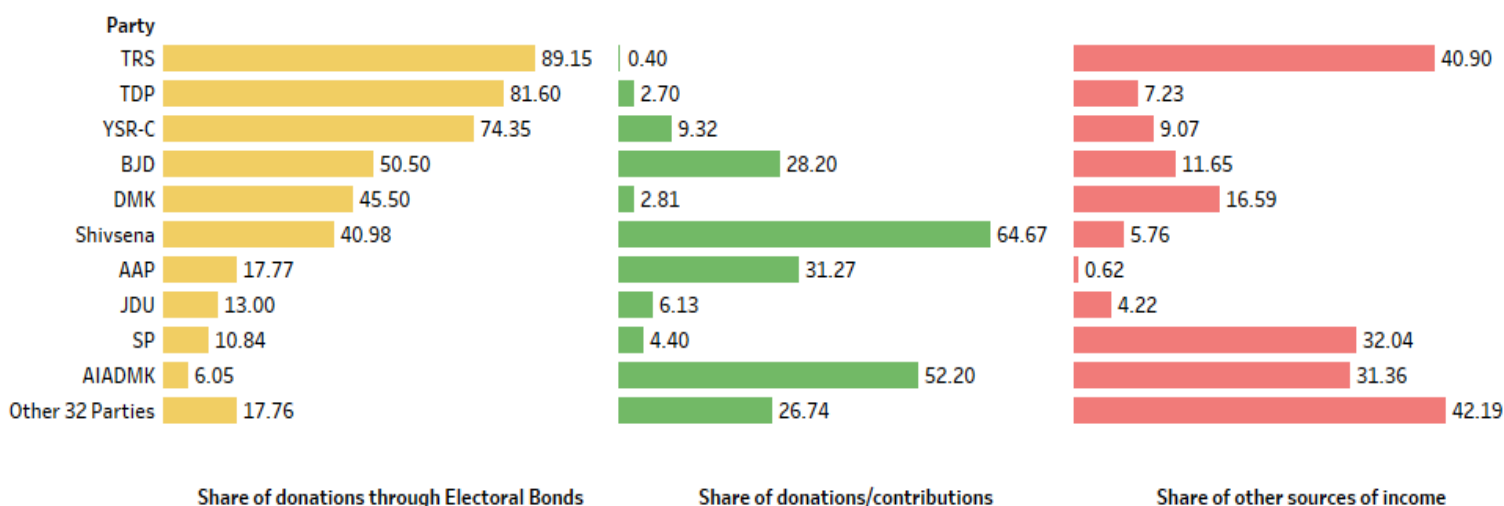

- **42 Regional Parties** collected **Rs 676.326 cr** or **77.03%** of their total income from **voluntary contributions** (includes donations via Electoral Bonds and other Donations & Contributions) for FY 2019-20.
- During FY 2019-20, out of the 42 political parties whose annual audit reports are available on the ECI website, **14 political parties** have declared receiving **donations through Electoral Bonds** amounting to a total of **Rs 447.498 cr**.
- **TRS** received the highest donations worth **Rs 89.1529 cr** or **68.34%** of its total income through Electoral Bonds followed by **TDP** declaring Electoral Bonds worth **Rs 81.60 cr** or **89.15%** and **YSR-C (Rs 74.35 cr or 80.171%)**.
- **12.96%** or **Rs 113.761 cr** of the total income was generated through **Interest Income & FDRs** by the political parties for FY 2019-20.
