Vote Share and Representativeness of Winners

Representation of Political Parties

ADR and Tripura Election Watch (TEW) have analysed the vote share for the 59 constituencies in the Tripura Assembly Elections, 2018. Data for vote share for Charilam constituency was not available at the time of creation of this report.

In the Tripura Assembly Elections 2018, 16 political parties and independents were in the fray. These included, 5 national political parties, 2 state political parties and 9 registered unrecognized parties. In comparison, during the 2013 Tripura State Assembly elections, 14 political parties were in the fray. These included, 5 national political parties, 4 state political parties and 5 registered unrecognized parties. This reflects that there has been no increase/ decrease in the number of political parties that contested in 2018 from 2013.




Figure: Number of Political Parties




Figure: Candidates Contesting from Different Types of Political Parties

Seat Distribution among Parties

- The national political parties have secured 52 out of 60 seats, with Bharatiya Janata Party winning 36 seats; Communist Party Of India (Marxist) winning 16 seats.
- The unrecognized political party Indigenous People's Front of Tripura won 8 seats.




Figure: Seat distribution in Tripura Assembly Elections, 2018

Voter Turnout

The voter turnout for the Tripura Assembly was **91%** whereas voter turnout in 2013 assembly elections was **94%**.




Figure: Comparative Analysis – Voter Turnout

Vote Share of Winner

The percentage of vote share was calculated by dividing the votes polled for the winner by the total number of valid votes polled. The value of vote share represents votes won by the winning candidates among the total number of valid votes polled.

$$\text{Votes Share} = \frac{(\text{Total Votes Polled for Winner})}{(\text{Total No. of Valid Votes Polled})}$$

The winners of the Tripura State Assembly elections in 2013 and 2018 won by an average was 53 % of total votes polled.




Figure: Comparative Analysis – Vote Share of Winners

Winners with highest vote share: 47 (80%) winners won with 50% and above of the total votes polled in their constituency. The top 3 winners who have attained the highest vote share during the Tripura State Assembly Elections, 2018 are given below:




Figure: No. of Winners- Vote Share

Party Wise Winners with Less than 50% of Vote Share Out of 35 winner of **Bharatiya Janata Party**, 4(11%) won with less than 50 % of total votes polled in their constituencies. 6(38%) out of 16 winners from **Communist Party of India (Marxist)** and 2(25%) out of 8 winners from **Indigenous People's Front Of Tripura** won with less than 50% of total votes polled in their constituency.




Figure: Party Wise Winners with Less than 50% of Vote Share

Representativeness of Winners

The percentage of representation is calculated by dividing the votes polled for the winner by the electorate i.e. the total number of registered voters. This value represents the percentage of votes won by the winning candidate among the total number of registered voters in the constituency.

$$\text{Representativeness} = \frac{\text{Total Votes polled for Winner}}{\text{Total No. of Registered Voters}}$$

All the winners of the Tripura State Assembly Elections, 2018 won with an average of 48% of the total registered voters. This implies that the winners represents on an average, 48% of the total electorate. In the Tripura State Assembly Elections, 2013 won by an average of 50% of the total registered votes.




Figure – Comparative Analysis- Representativeness of Winners




Figure: No. of Winners – Representativeness

Party-wise Winners with less than 50% of Representativeness: Out of 35 winner of **BJP**, **22(63%)** have won less than 50% of votes of the total registered voters in the constituency. **10 (63%)** out of 16 winners from **CPI (M)** and **5 (63%)** out of 8 winners from **Indigenous People's Front Of Tripura** have won less than 50 % of votes of the total registered voters in the constituency.




Figure: Party wise Winners with less than 50% of Representativeness




Figure: Winners and Margin of Victory
