Chhattisgarh Election Watch*

Lok Sabha elections 2009

Lok Sabha 2009 elections were held in Chhattisgarh on April 16, 2009. This chapter includes the analysis of voting trend, criminalization, money power, gender etc in these elections. Information provided by ECI and details from the affidavits filed by contesting candidates have been used for above analysis.

Growth of political parties

In Lok Sabha 2004, 20 parties and independents contested elections which rose to 27 parties and independents in Lok Sabha 2009 elections. This reflects a rise of 35 % in the number of parties from Lok Sabha 2004 elections to Lok Sabha 2009 elections.

Growth in number of candidates

A total of 178 candidates contested Lok Sabha 2009 elections from Chhattisgarh as compared to 102 candidates in Lok Sabha 2004 elections. This shows a growth of 74% in number of candidates contesting in 2009.

Executive summary for candidates and MPs

Summary for candidates

- Affidavits of 173 candidates out of the total 178 candidates were analysed by Chhattisgarh Election Watch (CEW).
- Out of the 173 candidates, 9 candidates or 5% declared pending criminal cases against them. Out of these 9 candidates with pending criminal cases, 5 had pending serious criminal cases like murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, robbery, extortion etc
- There was 1 red alert constituency where 3 or more contesting candidates had pending criminal cases.
- A total of 8 candidates out of 173 i.e. 5% were crorepatis.
- A total of 4 candidates declared zero assets.
- A total of 16 candidates declared liabilities above 5 lakhs.
- Among major parties, the average asset per candidate for INC was Rs. 1.25 crores and for BJP was Rs. 82.92 lakhs.
- 80% of candidates (138 of 173) had not furnished PAN card details.
- Number of women candidates was just 15 (8%) as compared to 163 of men (92%).

- More than 35.6% candidates (61 of 173) were graduates & above.
- None of the parties managed to get votes around 50%. The highest votes polled were approx 45% by BJP and about 25% of the total registered voters. INC managed to get 37% votes and 21% of the registered voters.

Summary for MPs

- Out of the 11 MPs, 2 MPs have pending criminal cases against them in Lok Sabha 2009 as compared to 3 MPs with pending criminal cases in Lok Saba 2004. No MP in Lok Sabha 2009 has pending serious criminal cases. Contrasting this with Lok Sabha 2004, 2 MPs (18 %) had serious pending criminal cases.
- Out of 11 MPs in Lok Sabha 2009, 3 MPs were crorepatis as compared to 0 crorepati MPs from Lok Sabha 2004.
- The average asset of a MP in 2004 Lok Sabha was Rs 31.96 lakhs which rose to Rs 1.15 cr in 2009.
- Average asset for a MP from Chhattisgarh was Rs 1.15 crores.
- Out of 15 women candidates, only 2 managed to win. Hence only 18% of MPs from Chhattisgarh in current Lok Sabha are women.

Voting and winning trend

Voting analysis


The % of votes polled by the major parties clearly shows that about 82% of the votes polled went either in favor of BJP or INC. Total voting in the state was only 55%. BJP managed approx 45 % of the votes cast and only 25% of the registered voters. INC managed just 37% votes cast and 21% registered voters. The total electorate in Chhattisgarh was 15,472,137 and the total votes cast were 85, 54,643.

Figure : Per cent of votes cast




Candidates Vs MPs

Analysis based on pending criminal cases

Pending criminal cases- analysis for candidates

Out of the information available for 173 candidates, 9 candidates or 5% declared pending criminal cases against them. Out of these 9 candidates with pending criminal cases, 5 had pending serious criminal cases like murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, robbery, extortion etc.

Party wise break up for candidates with pending criminal cases


Total 9 candidates contesting elections from Chhattisgarh had pending criminal cases against them. Out of the 11 candidates of INC, 1 (9%) had pending criminal cases. 2 candidates out of 11 candidates of BJP (18%) had declared pending criminal cases.

Out of these 9 candidates with pending criminal cases, 5 had pending serious criminal cases against them. These serious cases include murder and related charges, kidnapping, extortion, dacoity, theft, robbery etc. The break up is given in the table below.

Pending criminal cases- analysis for MPs


Out of the 11 MPs, 2 MPs have pending criminal cases against them in Lok Sabha 2009 as compared to 3 MPs with pending criminal cases in Lok Saba 2004. No MP in Lok Sabha 2009 has pending serious criminal cases. Contrasting this with Lok Sabha 2004, 2 MPs (18 %) had serious pending criminal cases.

Given below is a comparative analysis for MPs with pending criminal cases elected from Chhattisgarh. The presence of MPs with pending criminal cases from Chhattisgarh in Lok Sabha has decreased by 33%. There has been a 50% decrease in total pending criminal cases against MPs in 2009 elections as compared to 2004 elections. 2009 elections witnessed a decline in number of MPs with pending serious criminal cases against them by 100%.



Figure: Crorepati candidates from major parties






Analysis based on assets- for MPs

Out of 11 MPs in Lok Sabha 2009, 3 MPs are crorepatis as compared to 0 crorepati MPs from Lok Sabha 2004. The average asset of a MP in 2004 Lok Sabha was Rs 31.96 lakhs which rose to Rs 1.15 cr in 2009. Between 2004 & 2009 there has been an average asset increase of 259% for MPs.

Chances of winning based on assets

As can be seen from the table, the higher the assets the more are the chances of winning of a candidate. 38% of the candidates who declared assets more than 1 crore and above won. On the other hand less than 1% of candidates with assets less than 10 lakhs won. The election results seemed to be highly influenced by the money power of the candidates.



Figure: Comparison average assets for candidates & MPs in Lok Sabha 2009




Asset position in constituency among candidates and chances of winning

The following table gives an analysis of asset position in constituency among candidates (highest asset to lowest asset) and their chances of winning. From 6 constituencies i.e. 55% constituencies, candidates with highest declared assets according to their own self sworn affidavits emerged as MPs. From 18% constituencies candidates with second highest declared assets won. The number of MPs kept decreasing according to their position based on assets in the constituency as per their self declared affidavits.


Female representation in Lok Sabha 2009 elections
