Foreword

Parliamentary Democracy in India was structured on the British Model by leaders of the Indian Freedom Movement. It was a bold decision to super-impose a western system on a traditional society ridden by religion and caste. India never had a 'Kashmir to Kanyakumari' political union before the arrival of the East India Company and the British Raj. The fact that our religion and caste based society adapted and digested the western political system, to aggravate our ills instead of curing them, is quite disheartening.

The three arms of Parliamentary Democracy viz the Legislature, Judiciary and the Executive, at the national and the state level, have failed to arrest the steady deterioration in the functioning of our democracy. Criminalization of politics, unbridled corruption, the blatant role of money and muscle-power, the ubiquitous and all powerful stranglehold of religion and caste on politics, have become a part of our political system. Even the all powerful electronic and print media have not been able to educate voters towards promoting merit based voting. It is not clear whether the depressing plight of our democracy is due to ignorance of voters about the integrity of candidates or their indifference to candidates' honesty, sincerity and integrity. The mission undertaken by the Association for Democratic Rights (ADR) is like a breath of fresh air in a murky and suffocating environment, a new ray of hope for millions of frustrated voters. The stupendous task of collecting, collating, analyzing and presenting the information in an easily intelligible format, and that too within stiff deadlines, should be hailed as a national service of paramount importance. The ADR has succeeded in placing at voters' disposal ready information on candidates' criminal record, growth of their assets and liabilities, educational background, etc. well before the date of voting.

For the aam aadmi, the down-to-earth appeals by Aamir Khan, hits the nail on the head. The appeals contained in short video clips produced by the ADR, can be more effective than long winding lectures. ADR's continuing work has the potential of not only improving the quality of our MPs and MLAs but also reducing corruption in our political class. Declared (and undeclared) information on assets and liabilities can be investigated into by anti-corruption agencies and CBI as well as by the Income Tax Department, Enforcement Directorate, etc. Information published by the ADR prior to Assembly Elections 2012 in Goa about the financial, educational and criminal background of all candidates, was widely carried by the Goan media and avidly discussed by the civil society. That many highly corrupt candidates were elected inspite of a widespread awareness about the growth of their declared and undeclared assets, was more an indication of the voters' apathy towards the information provided by the ADR rather than shortcomings of the data itself.

As a concerned citizen, I am glad that the information disseminated by the ADR prior to the Assembly elections in 2012 in Goa is being made available in a booklet form. The ready availability of the information in a booklet will surely help the media, political analysts, research students and lay voters to do their bit to improve the quality of our democracy.

Selected Media Coverage of NEW/ADR reports

Out of 30 Candidates With Criminal Cases, Seven Have Serious Charges

As for those candidates with declared assets of below Rs five lakh, they are just a few and number three out of 129.

The ADR scrutiny, which is done by comparing figures of 2012 with that of 2007, shows that the average assets of the sitting MLAs in 2012 is ₹ 8.10 crore, a nearly 200 per cent increase from Rs 2.70 crore in the previous assembly elections.

The ADR's representatives, who have also done a comprehensive analysis of the candidates' background, have come out with several facts on candidates with criminal cases against them.

Candidates with criminal background are increasing, with 23 per cent having pending criminal cases in 2012 as against 18 per cent in 2007. However, this has had no impact on the parties' ticket awarding practices, with the INC giving the maximum number of tickets followed by the BJP and the AITC. The criminal charges are also serious, ranging from attempt to murder, theft, extortion etc. The contestant with the highest number of criminal cases against him is Mr Francisco (Mickky) Pacheco,

contesting from Nuvem. He has ten case against him for charges relating to extortion and abetment of suicide.

The ADR's findings were revealed to the media by Mr Bhaskar Assoldekar of the National Election Watch cell. He said that the trend of an increased number of wealthy candidates in Goa is not very different from that observed in the four other states where assembly elections are being held. He said that in general, all politicians have been getting richer and that political parties, in fact, give tickets to only the wealthy candidates and that there is no place for the common man as a political aspirant if he is not wealthy.

Earlier in the day, the ADR got together key speakers from various political parties to present the key features of their election manifestos to the public. The Congress party was represented by its working president Mr Francisco Sardinha while the BJP was represented by its general secretary in the state, Mr Wilfred Mesquita. Other political party leaders were also present. The ADR plans to come out with the asset profile of the remaining candidates soon and is in the process of collecting information about them.

not get richer. The average increase of a BJP MLAs worth was to the tune of Rs 2.53 crore at a growth percentage of 306%. Last elections the average worth of a BJP MLA was Rs 83 lakh. This election it is Rs 3.36 crore.

In last elections the average worth of a Congress MLA was Rs 3.90 crore. This year it is Rs 10.74 crore.

ADR also released figures of how rich and how criminal the candidates are. "There is an increasing tendency for political parties

to give candidates to the rich and the affluent. This is a disturbing trend. At the same time the per capita income of an average citizen is not increasing correspondingly," Ravi Barwal of the Association for Democratic Reforms told reporters.

True enough of the 129 candidates of major parties that the ADR has studied 71% are crorepati in stark contrast to the fact that in 2007 only 41% were crorepati.

Only three candidates of

the 129 had declared assets less than Rs 5 lakh. Among major parties the average asset per candidate for INC is Rs 8.44 crore, for BJP it's Rs 4.21 crore for NCP is Rs 10.79 crore for CVP it is Rs 3.85 crore for UCDP is Rs 81.65 lakh and MGP is Rs 33.50 crore. MGP figures have shot up because one of their candidates Dinar Taricar alone is worth Rs 211 crore.

The ADR says that they will release figures of more candidates in the days to come.

candidates submitted both now and last elections the 129 candidates that are contesting have an average growth in assets to the tune of Rs 5.38 crore.

At the top of the list lies Shyam Satardekar from Carapim whose assets grew from Rs 4.89 crore to Rs 30.20 crore. He is followed by Rajendra Alwar from Carapim whose assets

were increased from Rs 9.12 crore to Rs 38.28 crore an increase of Rs 29.16 crore. Pratapsingh Pawar also showed an increase of assets of Rs 17.04 crore from Rs 4.82 crore to Rs 25.87 crore.

It is interesting to note that both Satardekar and Rajendra Alwar are mining linked and the resulting increase in assets is

only a reflection of the mining boom that they profited from in the last few years.

Percentage wise Alwar's assets grew by a whopping 322% from Rs 9 lakh in 2007 to Rs 1.16 crore in 2012. Pratapsingh's assets grew by 354% from Rs 5.59 lakh to Rs 9.81 lakh while NDA's Shyam's assets grew by 488% from Rs 30 lakh to Rs 3.21 crore in 2012.

It is also interesting to note that the MLAs who have made it big are from the ruling party and none from the opposition.

However, this is not to say opposition MLAs did not make it big. Continued on page 6

Goa 2012 Assembly Elections

Goa Assembly Elections, 2012 was held during the months of February-March, 2012. A total of 215 candidates contested in the Goa State Assembly Elections and out of which, Goa Election Watch (GEW) & Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) have analyzed the data of 213 candidates. This report includes the analysis of criminal, financial, educational and other details of 213 candidates and 40 MLAs. Information provided by the Election Commission of India and details from the affidavits filed by the candidates have been used for the analysis.

Representation of political parties

In Goa 2007 Assembly Elections, 12 political parties contested, which increased to 17 in Goa 2012 Assembly Elections. This reflects an increase of 42% in the number of political parties contested the election from Goa 2007 Assembly Elections to Goa 2012 Assembly Elections.

Out of 215 candidates contesting in 2012 Assembly Elections, there were 206 (96%) men and 9 (4%) were women candidates. In 2007, out of 202 candidates, 188 were men (93%) while 14 (7%) were women. Hence, the percentage of women candidates has decreased by 3% from 2007 Assembly Elections to 2012 Assembly Elections.

Executive summary of candidates and MLAs

Summary of candidates

- Goa Election Watch (GEW) has analyzed affidavits of 213 candidates out of 215 candidates who contested in 2012 Assembly Elections.
- Out of these 213 candidates analyzed for the Goa Assembly Elections 2012, 38 candidates or 18% declared criminal cases against them. In 2007 assembly elections for the whole of Goa, 15% candidates had declared criminal cases against themselves.
- Among major parties, BJP had 10 out of 28 (36 %), INC had 9 out of 33 (27 %), AITC had 4 out of 19 (21 %), NCP had 2 out of 7 (29 %), GVP had 2 out of 9 (22 %), MGP had 1 out of 7 (14 %), JMP had 1 out of 3 (33 %), UGDP had 1 out of 7 (14 %) candidates with declared criminal cases.
- Among major parties, out of these 38 candidates with declared criminal cases, 9 (4 %) had declared serious criminal cases like murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, robbery, extortion etc. INC had 2, UGDP had 1, GVP had 1, NCP had 1.
- Among these 38 candidates who have declared criminal cases against themselves, Francisco Xavier Pacheco of GVP from Nuvem constituency with 10 cases including charges of abetment of suicide and extortion etc. followed by Atanasio Monserrate of INC from St. Cruz constituency had 2 cases

including a charge of voluntarily causing hurt etc. against him and Jennifer Monserrate of INC from Taleigao with 1 case including charges of voluntarily causing hurt.

- There were a total of 1 red alert constituencies (i.e. where 3 or more contesting candidates had declared criminal cases).
- A total of 114 candidates out of 213 analyzed i.e. 54% were crorepatis. In 2007, there were 41% crorepati candidates.
- The candidates with maximum assets in is Dinar Purshottam Kamat Tarcar of MGP from St. Cruz constituency with assets worth Rs. 211.76 Crores followed by Jawahar Dias an IND candidate from Fatorda with Rs. 39.14 crores and Nirmala Sawant, IND from Cumbarjua with Rs. 36.30 Crores.
- Zero candidates out of 213 analyzed declared zero assets.
- A total of 111 candidates out of 213 analyzed declared liabilities 5 Lakhs or above.
- Among major parties, the average asset per candidate for INC was approximate 8 Crore+ , For BJP was 4 Crore+ , For AITC was 1 Crore+ , For GVP was 3 Crore+ , For MGP was 33 Crore+ , For UGDP was 81 Lacs+ , For NCP was 10 Crore+ , For JD(U) was 3 Crore+ , For SJP(R) was 43 Lacs+ , For SP was 66 Lacs+
- Out of 213 candidates analyzed, 51 candidates (24%) have declared that they have not filed their ITR 10% of candidates (21 of 213 analyzed) had not furnished PAN card details.
- More than 36% candidates (76 of 213 analyzed) were graduates and above.
- Out of 215 contesting candidates for Goa Assembly Elections 2012, only 9 (4%) candidates are women; whereas in 2007 Goa Elections the number of female candidates were 14 out of 202, i.e. 7% for the whole state.

Summary of MLAs

- Goa Election Watch (GEW) has analyzed affidavits of all 40 newly elected MLAs of Goa 2012 Assembly Elections.
- Out of the 40 MLAs analyzed for Goa Assembly Elections, 12(30%) MLAs have declared criminal cases against them, in 2007 assembly elections for the whole of Goa, 9(23%) MLAs had declared criminal cases against themselves.
- Amongst major parties, every party has MLAs who have declared criminal cases. BJP has 7 out of 21(33%), INC has 3 out of 9(33%), GVP has 1 out of 2(50%) and 1 IND MLAs out of 5(20%) have declared criminal cases.
- Out of these 12 candidates with declared criminal cases, 3 have declared serious criminal cases like extortion, abetment of suicide, voluntarily causing grievous hurt etc. declared against them. INC has 2 and GVP has 1 such MLA.

- Among these 12 MLAs who have declared criminal cases against themselves, the following MLAs have declared the highest number of criminal cases against them: 1) Fransico Xavier Pacheco (of GVP, MLA from Nuvem) has declared 10 cases against himself including charges related to extortion and abetment of suicide, 2) Atanasio Monserrate (of INC, MLA from St. Cruz) has declared 2 cases against himself including 3 charges related to Voluntarily Causing hurt and 3) Jennifer Monserrate (of INC, MLA from Taleigao) has declared 1 case including 3 charges related to Voluntarily Causing hurt.
- Out of all 40 MLAs analyzed from Goa 2012 Assembly Elections, 37(93%) are crorepatis as compared to 55% crorepatis MLAs in Goa 2007 Assembly Election.
- The MLA with maximum assets in Goa is Pratapsingh Rane of INC from Poriem constituency with Rs 25.87 crore, followed by Vijai Sardesai an Independent MLA from Fatorda constituency with Rs 25.21 crore and Jennifer Monserrate of INC from Taleigao constituency with Assets worth Rs. 23.07 crores.
- 3 MLAs have declared assets of less than 1 Crores.
- A total of 12 (30%) MLAs out of 40 analyzed declared liabilities of Rs. 1 crore and above.
- Among major parties, the average asset per candidate for INC is Rs 13.41 crores, for MGP is Rs 6.78 crores, for BJP is Rs 4.96 crores and for GVP is Rs 4.43 crores.
- Vishnu Wagh of BJP from St. Andre constituency is the only MLA who has not filed his Income Tax Return. All the MLAs have declared their PAN card details.
- A total of 20 (50%) MLAs (out of 40 analyzed) are graduate or with higher educational qualifications.
- 20 (50%) MLAs (out of 40 analyzed) are graduates and above
- Out of 40 MLAs of Goa Assembly Elections 2012, only 1 (3%) MLA is woman. In 2007 also the number of women MLAs was 1.

Analysis based on declared criminal cases - Candidates

A total of 213 affidavits were analyzed by Goa Election Watch (GEW) for 2012 Assembly Elections. Out of these 213 candidates, 38 (18%) declared that they have criminal cases against them. Out of these 38 candidates with criminal cases, 9 had declared serious criminal cases like attempt to murder, extortion, theft, abetment of suicide etc. against them.

Party-wise break up of candidates with criminal cases

A total of 38 candidates contesting elections from Goa had declared criminal cases against them. 9 (27%) out of 33 candidates analyzed of INC, 10 (36%) out of 28 from BJP and 4 (21%) out of 213 of AITC had declared criminal cases against them. The party wise break up is given below:

Top 5 candidates with serious declared criminal cases

The table below lists top 5 candidates with most serious declared criminal cases. They have declared criminal cases of attempt to murder, theft, extortion etc against them. Background on Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) and National Election Watch (NEW)

About ADR & NEW

Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) was established in 1999 by group of professors from Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Ahmedabad. In 1999, a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) was filed by them with Delhi High Court asking the disclosure of criminal, financial and educational background of the candidates contesting elections. Based on this, the Supreme Court in 2002 and subsequently in 2003, made it mandatory for all candidates contesting elections to disclose Criminal, Financial and educational background prior to the polls by filing an affidavit with Election Commission.

The first election watch was conducted by ADR in 2002 for Gujrat Assembly Elections whereby detailed analysis of the backgrounds of candidates contesting elections was provided to the electorate in order to help the electorate make an informed choice during polls. Since then ADR has conducted Election Watches for almost all state and parliament elections in collaboration with the National Election Watch. It conducts multiple projects aimed at increasing transparency and accountability in the political and electoral system of the country.

Our Achievements

- ADR won the NASSCOM award for ICT led Innovation by Multi-stakeholder Partnerships. This award was for the Election Watch software of ADR and Webrosoft.
- ADR won two milestone judgments on disclosure of candidate's criminal and financial records from the Supreme Court in May 2002 and March 2003 respectively. Since then, 1200 NGOs from all over the country are supporting ADR and ADR in partnership with its partners has organized Citizen Election Watch for all major elections and disclosed candidate's background information to the media and the public.
- The Election Commission has completed a massive exercise based on the Gujarat Election Watch report to verify information filed by candidates in the nomination papers and affidavits, and has started proceedings against candidates with false declarations.
- A Bill on Electoral Expenses was passed in September 2003. The EC has asked candidates to file a statement of expenses in every three days during the campaign. This information is made available to citizens on request to Returning Officers, District Election Officers and the CEOs.
- Civil Society non-partisan Election Watches are springing up in different states. In the Lok Sabha 2004 Elections, 19 States and 5 Union Territories carried out Election Watches. In the Lok Sabha 2009 elections, Election Watches were held in all states and union territories in the country.

- Bihar Election Watch in October-November 2005 resulted in intense pressure on the Chief Minister designate due to the extensive media coverage of candidate's background. As a result, for the first time, Bihar has a Council of Ministers without any known criminal record.
- The Election Commission inaugurated Civil Society led National Conferences on Electoral Reforms in Ahmedabad, Bangalore, Patna, Lucknow, Mumbai, Bhopal and Chennai. These Conferences were action oriented and resulted in successful Election Watch campaigns.
- The EC issued several very significant orders in the last two years relating to candidate disclosure, ensuring those affidavits are complete, taking action against false affidavits based on complaints, and disclosing electoral expenses.
- In April 2008, ADR obtained a landmark ruling from the Central Information Commission (CIC) saying that Income Tax Returns of Political Parties would now be available in the public domain along with the assessment orders.
- In the Karnataka Assembly Elections, 2008, there was a reduction in the number of candidates with serious offenses put up by parties. There were 93 such cases against candidates in the 2008 elections, down from 217 in the 2004 assembly elections.
- Overall, the percentage of candidates with declared criminal cases came down from 20% to 14% in the assembly elections held in the country in 2008 for the states of Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, NCT of Delhi and Mizoram.
- A large number of candidates with serious declared cases that contested Lok Sabha 2009 elections like Pappu Yadav, Atiq Ahmed, Mukhtar Ansari, Akhilesh Singh, etc. lost.
- The number of total serious IPC sections against MPs decrease from 296 in Lok Sabha 2004 to 274 in Lok Sabha 2009.
- On Jan 25, 2010 both the Congress Chief Ms Sonia Gandhi and leader of opposition in Lok Sabha Ms Sushma Swaraj of BJP made public statements calling for a consensus on barring candidates with criminal backgrounds from contesting elections.
- On Feb 3, 2010 Prime Minister Manmohan Singh asked his Cabinet colleagues to disclose details of their assets and liabilities and refrain from dealing with the government on immovable property.
- Because of an RTI application that ADR has been following up with the CIC for nearly the past 2 years, the contribution reports of major political parties have been made public. Added to this is the fact that the Election Commission has taken proactive steps towards bringing in some level of accountability in the functioning of the political parties by getting the ICAI to develop reporting formats for political parties
- In May, 2010, the Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh, Ms. Mayawati had announced the expulsion of about 500 party leaders with criminal past.
- In January 2011, the Election Commission of India entrusted the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) with the task of developing accounting format for political parties.
- Details of the movable and immovable assets of 30 Bihar ministers, including that of CM Nitish Kumar, were uploaded on the government website in January, 2011. It is seen as a step aimed at ending corruption promised by the Chief Minister himself.
