# Analysis of Funds Collected and Expenditure Incurred by National and Regional Political Parties of Uttar Pradesh - Lok Sabha 2004, 2009 & 2014

# A REPORT BY ASSOCIATION FOR DEMOCRATIC REFORMS

&

**UTTAR PRADESH ELECTION WATCH** 

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## **Executive Summary**

- Political parties are required to submit a statement of election expenditure to the Election Commission within 90 days of completion of General Elections.
- The expenditure statement contains details of the total amount received as funds in the form of cash, cheques and demand drafts and the total amount spent under various heads.
- The expenditure statement contains information on the amount spent on the following heads at the state,
   district and constituency levels by the party:
  - o Publicity
  - o Travel expenses
  - Expenditure towards candidates
  - Other expenses
- Political parties submit these statements providing information of funds collected and spent between announcement and completion of elections. This period could be between 3 weeks to 3 months based on the notification issued by the Election Commission.
- The focus of this report is the expenditure of National and Regional Parties of **Uttar Pradesh** during Lok Sabha 2014 and analyses the funds received and expenditure incurred by the Political Parties, **during the election period of 73 days (05-03-2014 to 16-05-2014).**

#### Recognised parties which contested Lok Sabha elections from Uttar Pradesh

- 26<sup>th</sup> August, 2014 was the last date of filing of election expenditure statements of National Parties which was 90 days from 28<sup>th</sup> May on which the election results were declared.
- The six National Parties which contested from Uttar Pradesh in Lok Sabha elections were BJP, BSP, CPI, CPM, INC and NCP while a total of eight state recognised parties contested in the Lok Sabha elections from Uttar Pradesh. They were AAP, AIFB, AITC, IUML, JDU, RLD, SHS and SP.
- The **ECI** sent **two reminder letters** to **AAP** asking for statements of elections expenditure of the party to the Lok Sabha elections and sent a notice on 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2015 after which the party submitted the details.



#### Funds collected by National Parties during the Lok Sabha elections:

- Total funds collected by the National Parties, from all over India, in cash, cheque/DD or in kind, during Lok
   Sabha elections held in 2004 was Rs 223.80 crores while during Lok Sabha 2009 elections, it increased by 282%, to Rs 854.89 crores.
- The total funds collected by the National Parties during Lok Sabha 2014 elections increased by 35.53%, to Rs 1158.59 crores from Rs 854.89 crores during Lok Sabha 2009.
- Over a period of 10 years, the funds collected by National Parties during Lok Sabha elections increased by 418%.



#### Funds collected by Regional Parties of Uttar Pradesh during the Lok Sabha elections:

- A total of 5 Regional Parties out of 8 considered in this report contested as recognised parties in all the three Lok Sabha elections. They are AIFB, AITC, JDU, Shiv Sena and SP.
- Total funds collected, from all over India, by these 5 Regional Parties, during **Lok Sabha** elections held in **2004** was **Rs 13.90** crores while during Lok Sabha 2009 elections, it increased by **149%**, to **Rs 34.64** crores and to **Rs 118.19** crores during Lok Sabha elections, 2014.
- Over a period of 10 years, the funds collected by the 5 Regional Parties, from all over India, during Lok
   Sabha elections increased by 750%.

#### **Expenditure incurred by National Parties during the Lok Sabha elections:**


- Total expenditure incurred by the National Parties, in cash or cheque/DD, during **Lok Sabha** elections held in **2004** was **Rs 269.42 crores** while during Lok Sabha 2009 elections, it **increased by 225%**, to **Rs 875.81 crores**.
- The total expenditure of the National Parties during Lok Sabha 2014 elections increased by 49.43%, to Rs 1308.75 crores from Rs 875.81 crores during Lok Sabha 2009.
- Over a period of 10 years, the expenditure incurred by National Parties during Lok Sabha elections increased by 386%.





#### **Expenditure incurred by Regional Parties during the Lok Sabha elections:**

- 5 Regional Recognised Parties contested in all three Lok Sabha elections, as mentioned earlier. Total expenditure incurred by them, all over India, during Lok Sabha elections held in 2004 was Rs 10.49 crores while during Lok Sabha 2009 elections, it increased by 205%, to Rs 32.02 crores and in 2014, it rose to Rs 96.28 crores.
- Over a period of 10 years, the expenditure incurred by the 5 Regional Parties during Lok Sabha elections increased by 818%.




Graph: Expenditure incurred by Regional Political Parties during Lok Sabha elections held in 2004, 2009 and 2014

#### Expenditure of Political Parties under various heads during Lok Sabha elections, 2014:

- The main heads under which political parties declare their expenses are publicity, travel, other/ miscellaneous expenses and expenditure on candidates.
- **BJP** declared spending **Rs 463.17 crores on publicity** while **INC** spent **Rs 346.41 crores**, NCP Rs 30.98 crores, BSP Rs 12.75 crores, CPM Rs 4.94 crores and CPI Rs 0.72 crores.
- BJP declared an equal amount of expenditure on candidates as that incurred on travel during Lok Sabha 2014 elections. The party spent Rs 159.81 crores on its candidates while INC spent Rs 96.70 crores on its candidates.
- Among the Regional Parties of Uttar Pradesh, SP declared spending Rs 26.51 crores on publicity while RLD spent Rs 19 lakhs.
- **SP**'s maximum election expenditure was on **travel** of the party's star campaigners, leaders and workers. The party declared **Rs 27.11 crores** spent on travel while **RLD** declared **Rs 54 lakhs** expenditure on travel.
- RLD declared that the party incurred the least expenditure on miscellaneous expenses, amounting to a total of Rs 2 lakhs while SP spent Rs 5.29 crores on miscellaneous expenses.








Graph: Expenditure of Regional Parties under various heads during Lok Sabha Elections, 2014

#### Expenditure of Political Parties on Publicity during Lok Sabha elections, 2014:

- National Parties collectively spent Rs 661.26 crores (or 76.98%) on media advertisement, Rs 126.94 crores (or 14.78%) on public meetings and Rs 70.77 crores (or 8.24%) on publicity materials during Lok Sabha Elections, 2014.
- BJP spent the maximum amount of Rs 342.36 crores on media advertisement followed by Rs 89.56 crores on public meetings and Rs 31.35 crores on publicity materials.
- INC spent the maximum amount of Rs 289.22 crores on media advertisement followed by Rs 33.08 crores on public meetings and Rs 24.11 crores on publicity materials.
- Among the Regional Parties, SP spent Rs 25.62 crores on media advertisement and Rs 89 lakhs on publicity materials. The party has declared that no expenditure was incurred on public meetings during Lok Sabha elections, 2014.

### **Detailed Report**

#### Recognised parties which contested Lok Sabha elections from Uttar Pradesh

- 13<sup>th</sup> August, 2014 was the last date of filing of election expenditure statements of National Parties which was 90 days from 16<sup>th</sup> May on which the election results were declared.
- The six National Parties which contested from Uttar Pradesh in Lok Sabha elections were BJP, BSP, CPI, CPM, INC and NCP while a total of eight state recognised parties contested in the Lok Sabha elections from Uttar Pradesh. They were AAP, AIFB, AITC, IUML, JDU, RLD, SHS and SP.
- The **ECI** sent **two reminder letters** to **AAP** asking for statements of elections expenditure of the party to the Lok Sabha elections and sent a notice on 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2015 after which the party submitted the details.
- Based on the information available on the website of the Election Commission of India, the ECI received the expenditure statements of INC on 22<sup>nd</sup> Dec,'14, BJP on 12<sup>th</sup> Jan,'15, BSP on 8<sup>th</sup> Aug,'14, NCP on 22<sup>nd</sup> Aug,'14, CPI on 27<sup>th</sup> Oct,'14and CPM's expenditure statements on 25<sup>th</sup> Aug,'14.
- It is to be noted that while BJP, BSP, NCP, CPI and CPM submitted their expenditure statements with details of only Lok Sabha elections, 2014, the expenditure statement of INC included details of elections to Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Sikkim and Odisha Assemblies. As the details were not segregated by INC, the information is taken as is submitted by the party.
- Similarly, for Lok Sabha elections, 2004, the expenditure statements of BSP, CPI and CPM contained details of expenditure incurred during Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Odisha and Sikkim Assembly Elections. The complete information as submitted by the National Parties have been taken into consideration during the preparation of this report.


#### Funds collected by National Parties during Lok Sabha elections

- The funds declared as collected by political parties were **collected between the date of announcement of** elections and the date of completion of elections: 73 days (05-03-2014 to 16-05-2014).
- Total funds collected by the National Parties, in cash, cheque/DD or in kind, during Lok Sabha elections held
  in 2004 was Rs 223.80 crores while during Lok Sabha 2009 elections increased by 282%, to Rs 854.89 crores.
- The total funds collected by the National Parties during Lok Sabha 2014 elections **increased by 35.53%**, to **Rs 1158.59 crores** from Rs 854.89 crores during Lok Sabha 2009.
- Over a period of 10 years, the funds collected by National Parties during Lok Sabha elections increased by 418%.

#### Funds collected by Regional Parties during Lok Sabha elections


- A total of 5 Regional Parties out of 8 considered in this report **contested as recognised parties in all the three Lok Sabha elections**. They are AIFB, AITC, JDU, Shiv Sena and SP.
- Total funds collected, from all over India, by these 5 Regional Parties, during Lok Sabha elections held in 2004 was Rs 13.90 crores while during Lok Sabha 2009 elections, it increased by 149%, to Rs 34.64 crores and to Rs 118.19 crores during Lok Sabha elections, 2014.
- Over a period of 10 years, the funds collected by the 5 Regional Parties, from all over India, during Lok Sabha elections increased by 750%.
- It is to be noted that AIFB has declared that the party did not collect any funds during the election period of Lok Sabha 2014.
- RLD declared the least amount of funds collected (Rs 1.25 lakhs) from all over India during Lok Sabha elections, 2014 among all the parties considered for this report.

Graph: Funds collected by Regional Parties of Uttar Pradesh during Lok Sabha Elections, 2004, 2009 and 2014


#### **Expenditure incurred by National Parties during Lok Sabha elections**

- Total expenditure incurred by the National Parties, in cash or cheque/DD, during **Lok Sabha** elections held in **2004** was Rs 269.42 crores while during Lok Sabha 2009 elections **increased by 225%**, to **Rs 875.81 crores**
- The total expenditure of the National Parties during Lok Sabha 2014 elections increased by 49.43%, to Rs 1308.75 crores from Rs 875.81 crores during Lok Sabha 2009.
- Over a period of 10 years, the expenditure incurred by National Parties during Lok Sabha elections increased by 386%.

#### **Expenditure incurred by Regional Parties during the Lok Sabha elections**

- 5 Regional Recognised Parties contested in all three Lok Sabha elections, as mentioned earlier.
- Total expenditure incurred by them, all over India, during Lok Sabha elections held in 2004 was Rs 10.49 crores while during Lok Sabha 2009 elections, it increased by 205%, to Rs 32.02 crores and in 2014, it rose to Rs 96.28 crores.
- Over a period of 10 years, the expenditure incurred by the 5 Regional Parties during Lok Sabha elections increased by 818%.
- IUML and RLD declared the least expenditure of Rs 20 lakhs each during Lok Sabha elections, 2014 among the parties considered for this report while the maximum expenditure was declared by SP, with a total of Rs 64.11 crores, incurred all over India.




- The main heads under which political parties declare their expenses are **publicity**, **travel**, **other/ miscellaneous expenses and expenditure on candidates**.
- BJP declared spending Rs 463.17 crores on publicity while INC spent Rs 346.41 crores, NCP Rs 30.98 crores, BSP Rs 12.75 crores, CPM Rs 4.94 crores and CPI Rs 0.72 crores.
- BJP's declared expenditure on travel (for leaders, workers and star campaigners) was Rs 159.15 crores while INC spent Rs 129.50 crores on travel. NCP Rs 3.73 crores, BSP Rs 17.31 crores, CPM Rs 1.94 crores and CPI Rs 0.17 crores.
- BJP declared an equal amount of expenditure on candidates as that incurred on travel during Lok Sabha 2014 elections. The party spent Rs 159.81 crores on its candidates while INC spent Rs 96.70 crores on its candidates.

#### **Expenditure of Regional Parties under various heads**


- Among the Regional Parties of Uttar Pradesh, SP declared spending Rs 26.51 crores on publicity while RLD spent Rs 19 lakhs and JDU Rs 2.62 crores.
- **SP**'s maximum election expenditure was on **travel** of the party's star campaigners, leaders and workers. The party declared **Rs 27.11 crores** spent on travel while **RLD** declared **Rs 54 lakhs** of expenditure on travel.
- RLD declared that the party incurred the least expenditure on miscellaneous expenses, amounting to a total of Rs 2 lakhs while SP spent Rs 5.29 crores on miscellaneous expenses.

Graph: Expenditure of Regional Parties under various heads during Lok Sabha Elections, 2014


#### Expenditure of Political Parties of Uttar Pradesh on Publicity during Lok Sabha elections, 2014

- There are three main items listed under publicity expenditure: **expense on media advertisement** (print & electronic, bulk sms, cable, website, TV channels) **publicity material** (hoardings, posters, banners etc.), **expenses on public meetings** (processions, rallies etc.).
- National Parties collectively spent Rs 661.26 crores (or 76.98%) on media advertisement, Rs 126.94 crores (or 14.78%) on public meetings and Rs 70.77 crores (or 8.24%) on publicity materials during Lok Sabha Elections, 2014.
- BJP spent the maximum amount of Rs 342.36 crores on media advertisement followed by Rs 89.56 crores on public meetings and Rs 31.35 crores on publicity materials.
- INC spent the maximum amount of Rs 289.22 crores on media advertisement followed by Rs 33.08 crores
  on public meetings and Rs 24.11 crores on publicity materials, while BSP spent Rs 6.59 crores on publicity
  materials and Rs 3.90 crores on media advertisement.






Graph: Comparison of expenditure on publicity between BJP and INC, Lok Sabha Elections 2014


Graph: Comparison of expenditure on publicity between SP and RLD Lok Sabha Elections 2014





#### Expenditure of Political Parties on Travel during Lok Sabha elections, 2014

- BJP declared a travel expenditure of Rs 159.15 crores which is 51% of the total travel expenditure of six National Parties.
- INC declared a total travel expenditure of Rs 129.50 crores (41% of total travel expenses of all National Parties).
- **CPI** declared **the least amount among National Parties under travel expenses.** The National Party declared a total of Rs 0.17 crores as expenditure on travel of leaders, workers and Star campaigners.




Graph: Total expenditure incurred by National Parties on travel during Lok Sabha Elections, 2014

- Among the Regional Parties of Uttar Pradesh, SP declared a total of Rs 27.113 crores spent on the travel of star campaigners during Lok Sabha elections, 2014 while the party did not incur any expenditure on travel of leaders and workers.
- **RLD** incurred a total of **Rs 54 lakhs** on the travel of star campaigners while **no amount** was spent on travel of leaders and workers.




Graph: Comparison of expenditure on travel between SP and RLD, Lok Sabha Elections 2014

#### **Expenditure of Political Parties on Candidates during Lok Sabha elections**

- In 10 years, during Lok Sabha 2004, 2009 and 2014 elections, INC declared spending **Rs 193.74 crores on candidates** (46% of total expenditure on candidates by National Parties).
- BJP declared that the party incurred no expenditure on candidates during Lok Sabha 2004 and 2009 elections and spent Rs 159.81 crores during Lok Sabha elections 2014.
- **BSP** declared that the party incurred no expenditure on candidates during Lok Sabha elections, 2009 and 2014 but declared a total of Rs 12.6 lakhs as expenditure towards candidates during Lok Sabha elections, 2004.

Graph: Total expenditure incurred by National Parties on candidates during Lok Sabha Elections, 2004, 2009 and 2014






- Among the Regional Parties of Uttar Pradesh, SP, JD(U), RJD AITC and AIFB had not incurred any
  expenditure towards candidates during Lok Sabha elections 2004 and 2009.
- **During Lok Sabha elections, 2014, SP** spent **Rs 5.2** crores on candidates while JD(U) spent **Rs 1.975 crores** and **RLD,** Rs 88 lakhs on candidates.
- Of all the regional parties considered in the report, AAP incurred the maximum expenditure of **Rs 30.405 crores** on candidates, contesting from all over India.

#### Expenditure of National Parties on other/ miscellaneous expenses during Lok Sabha elections

- In the format of expenditure statement circulated by the ECI, political parties are required to declare any other miscellaneous expenditure incurred by them during the election period which is not covered under other heads.
- BJP declared the highest amount under miscellaneous expenses among all the National Parties. The party declared Rs 25.85 crores during Lok Sabha 2004, Rs 197.93 crores during Lok Sabha 2009 and Rs 90.15 crores during Lok Sabha 2014. Thus a total of Rs 313.93 crores declared as miscellaneous expenses.
- INC declared Rs 14.62 crores during Lok Sabha 2004, Rs 18.59 crores during Lok Sabha 2009 and Rs 10.30 crores during Lok Sabha 2014.

#### **Recommendations of ADR**

- It must be made mandatory for all political parties to submit their statements of expenditure in the format given by the ECI, within the prescribed time limit. Political parties not submitting on time or in the prescribed format should be heavily penalized.
- The details of all donors who contribute to national and regional parties exclusively for their election campaigns must be declared in the public domain irrespective of the amount donated.
- A format similar to the donations report along with the date of donations, submitted to the ECI on an annual basis, has to be prescribed for the expenditure statement so as to bring in more transparency in the finances of the political parties especially during elections when it is said that black money plays a major role.
- Similar to the shadow observers of the ECI for monitoring expenditure of candidates, there must also be observers for monitoring the expenditure of political parties.
