Summary and Highlights

The National Election Watch and Association of Democratic Reforms analysed the self-sworn affidavits of **8289 out of 8472** candidates contested in the five states of Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Mizoram, Chhattisgarh and Telangana. 183 candidates had not been analysed as their affidavits were badly scanned.

Analysis of Criminal Background, Financial, Education, Gender and other details of Candidates

Criminal Background

Candidates with Criminal cases: Out of 8289 candidates analysed in the five states, **1348 (16%)** had declared criminal cases against themselves in their affidavit.

Candidates with serious criminal cases: **854 (10%)** candidates had declared serious criminal cases against themselves.




Figure: State wise candidates with criminal cases

Crorepati Candidates: Out of 8289 candidates analysed in 5 states, **2141(26%)** were crorepati.




Figure: State Wise Crorepati Candidates

Other Background Details

Overall Educational Details: **4038(49%)** candidates had declared their educational qualification to be between **5th to 12th pass**, while **3551(43%)** candidates were graduates or had higher degrees. **389** candidates had declared themselves as just **literate**s and **126** candidates were **illiterate**.

Overall Age Details: **5740 (69%)** candidates had declared their age to be between **25 to 50 years** whereas **2482(30%)** candidates had declared their age to be between **51 to 80 years**. **6** candidates had declared their age to be **above 80 years** while **1** candidate had declared his age to be **below 25 years**. **60** candidates had **not declared** their age.

Overall Gender Details: Out of 8289 candidates, 7580 were men whereas **709(9%)** were women.

Analysis of Criminal Background, Financial, Education, Gender and other details of MLAs

National Election Watch and Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) have analysed the self-sworn affidavits of 678 out of 679 newly elected MLAs in the five states of Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Mizoram, Chhattisgarh and Telangana. Due to the demise of one BSP candidate, Laxman Singh from Ramgarh constituency in Rajasthan Assembly, the election to this constituency was adjourned.

Criminal background

- **MLAs with criminal cases:** Out of the 678 MLAs analysed, 239(35%) MLAs have declared criminal cases against themselves.
- **MLAs with serious criminal cases:** 136(20%) MLAs have declared serious criminal cases including cases such as **murder, attempt to murder** etc.
- **MLAs with criminal cases: State- wise :** Given below is the state- wise list of MLAs with pending criminal cases, in the respective 5 assemblies:

Criteria for serious criminal cases

1. Offence for which maximum punishment is of 5 years or more.
2. If an offence is non-bailable
3. If it is an electoral offence (for eg. IPC 171E or bribery)
4. Offence related to loss to exchequer
5. Offences that are assault, murder, kidnap, rape related
6. Offences that are mentioned in Representation of the People Act (Section 8)
7. Offences under Prevention of Corruption Act
8. Crimes against women.




Figure: State wise number of MLAs with declared criminal cases




Figure: State-wise Percentage of Crorepati MLAs




Figure: Analysis of MLAs on the basis of educational qualification




Figure: Analysis of MLAs on the basis of age groups




Figure: State- wise Gender Details of MLAs
