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FOREWORD



This report is essentially an iceberg; the visible portion is a mere 12 per cent of the whole, the balance 88 per cent is left to the imagination of the readers. The Election Watch is not supposed to conduct investigations into the life style of the candidates, it has to, as per the rules of fair play, rely upon the affidavits sworn by the candidates. The Odisha Election Watch (OEW) as a part of the National Election Watch undertook the onerous duty of making every detail gleaned from the candidates' affidavits public so that the electorate in particular and the public in general make an assessment of the person or persons they are about to select through their votes as their representative to the Assembly and Lok Sabha. We in the OEW have made some analytical statements (pardon us they are not our judgments) out of data collected from affidavits. It is up to the voters who may, if they feel aggrieved that a particular candidate has misstated any fact or suppressed any; file an election dispute which may result in disqualification of the concerned candidate. It is this fear that makes affidavits a crucial document. A keen watcher may try to compare his intimate knowledge of a candidate with his (candidate's) declarations in affidavit and conclude if the candidate is cheating his voters. We wished to make people aware that if they find the 12 percent revealed in affidavits indicative of the rest 88 per cent they should reject them at the hustings. If they do not reject it justifies the saying "you deserve the candidate you select".

Every candidate aspires to be people's representative and in that capacity would be law maker and tax levier. He is not expected to have broken any law or to have defaulted in payment of government or bank dues. A PAN (Permanent Account Number) card is a simple requirement for every citizen, it is also an ID (identity) card. It is indicative of one's intention to pay income tax if he/she is above IT exemption limit. Some candidates do not show that they have PAN and thereby do not show transparency in their public life. Educational qualification, crime history, property value etc. are more for public consumption than for its worth.

We were to watch the 2009 Assembly Election and the State's part of the National Election and make comments while elections were conducted. Now that it is over we are inclined to make some observations as above. It is a sad commentary on our democracy that political parties have been ignoring criminal behaviour of the candidates they nominate, fielding candidates with higher and higher income each subsequent elections, thereby making us feel that in their perception the amount of wealth they have acquired legally or otherwise and not the spirit of public service is the most important winnability criterion. Obviously concern for garibi elimination programmes are skin deep. Character and probity in public life are at a discount.

Affidavits are for public consumption and therefore may be hiding nine tenths of what the candidate really is. Probity in Public Life is a sine qua non for success of Democracy. We have been observing that with every passing election, transparency and probity in public life are widening and a day may come when democracy will no longer be a gamble for the undeservingly rich but a profession for the public spirited.

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Odisha Assembly Elections 2009

Odisha Assembly elections 2009 were held along with Lok Sabha 2009 elections in two phases on April 16, 2009 & April 23, 2009. This report includes the analysis of voting trends, criminalization of politics, use of money power, gender disparities etc in these elections. Information provided by Election commission of India (ECI) and details from the affidavits filed by candidates have been used for above analysis.

Growth of political parties

In Odisha Assembly elections 2004, 29 parties contested elections which rose to 32 parties in Odisha Assembly 2009 elections. This reflects a rise of 10 % in the number of parties from Odisha Assembly 2004 Elections to Odisha Assembly 2009 Elections.

Growth in number of candidates

1288 candidates contested Assembly 2009 elections from Odisha as compared to 802 candidates in Odisha Assembly 2004 election. This shows a growth of 61% in number of candidates contesting in 2009.

Executive summary for candidates and MLAs

Summary for candidates

- Affidavits of 1288 candidates who contested Odisha Assembly 2009 elections were analyzed by Odisha Election Watch (OEW).
- Out of 1288 candidates, 295 candidates or 23% declared pending criminal cases against them. INC had 60 out of 147(41%) candidates with pending criminal cases; BJP had 50 out of 145 (34%) candidates & BJD 37 out of 129 (29%) candidates with pending criminal cases.
- Out of these 295 candidates with pending criminal cases, 191 had pending serious criminal cases like murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, robbery, extortion etc. INC had 40, BJP had 37 and BJD had 27 candidates with pending serious criminal cases.
- There were 541 IPC charges of heinous nature on the candidates which included murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, extortion, etc.
- There were a total of 47 red alert constituencies where 3 or more contesting candidates had pending criminal cases. Champua & Talcher constituency each had 8 candidates with pending criminal cases.
- A total of 93 candidates out of 1288 i.e. 7.22% were crorepatis.
- A total of 73 candidates declared zero assets.
- A total of 164 candidates declared liabilities of Rs.5 lakhs and above.
- Among major parties, the average asset per candidate for INC was Rs. 73 Lakhs, for BJP it was Rs.1 crore & for BJD it was Rs.94 lakhs.
- A total of 69% of candidates (894 of 1288) had not furnished PAN card details.
- Number of women candidates was just 126 (10%) as compared to 1162 of men (90%).
- More than 50% candidates (638 of 1288) were graduates & above.





Summary for MLAs

- Affidavits of all the 147 MLAs were analyzed by OEW.
- Of the 20 candidates with the most serious criminal cases against them, only 8 won and the remaining 12 were rejected by the voters.
- Out of 147 MLAs from Odisha, 48 (33%) have pending criminal cases against them. There are 11 MLAs of INC, 4 of BJP, 27 of BJD and 5 MLAs belonging to other parties who have pending criminal cases against them.
- Out of these 48 MLAs with pending criminal cases, 31 have pending serious criminal cases against them. Party
 wise break up for MLAs with pending serious criminal cases 7 of INC, 18 of BJD, 3 of BJP and 2 MLAs belonging
 to other parties.
- Out of 147 MLAs in Odisha, 33 MLAs (22%) are Crorepati.
- Among major parties, the average asset per MLA for INC is Rs. 51.81 lakhs, BJP is Rs 1.40 crores & BJD is Rs 1.05 crores.
- Average asset for a MLA in Odisha is Rs 1.71 crores.
- Out of 147 MLAs, 57 have not declared their PAN details.
- Out of 126 women candidates, only 7 managed to win. Hence only 6% of MLAs in Odisha are women.





Voting and winning trend

There are 147 assembly constituencies in Odisha for which elections were held. The total votes cast were 17,765,071. BJD managed to get 39% of votes followed by 29% of votes for INC and 15% votes for BJP. The further break up is given in the table below:




Figure: % of votes cast




Figure: Candidates vs MLAs- party wise





Analysis based on pending criminal cases

Analysis based on pending criminal cases- for candidates

Affidavits of all 1288 candidates were analyzed by Odisha Election Watch (OEW) for Odisha Assembly 2009 elections. Out of these 1288 candidates, 295 candidates or 23% declared pending criminal cases against them. Out of these 295 candidates with pending criminal cases, 191 candidates had pending serious criminal cases like murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, robbery, extortion etc.

Party wise break up for candidates with pending criminal cases

Total 295 candidates who contested in Odisha Assembly 2009 elections had pending criminal cases against them. Out of 147 candidates of INC, 60(41%) had pending criminal cases. 50 out of 145 (34%) candidates of BJP had pending criminal cases & 37 of 129 (29%) candidates of BJD had pending criminal cases. The break up is given in the table below.




Figure: Comparison of pending criminal cases and serious pending criminal cases for candidates of main parties

The following figure shows comparosion of total violent crimes vs total theft related crimes:








Figure: Serious IPC section break up for candidates of major parties




Figure: Comparison total serious crimes vs total violent crimes (murder, kidnapping etc) - party wise

Analysis based on pending criminal cases – for MLAs

Out of 147 MLAs in Odisha Assembly 2009, 48 MLAs have pending criminal cases against them. Out of these 48 MLAs, 31 have pending serious criminal cases against them. Comparing this with Assembly 2004, 41 MLAs had pending criminal cases against them.

Party wise break up for MLAs with pending criminal cases

Out of total 48 MLAs with pending criminal cases, 27 are from BJD, 11 from INC & 5 from BJP.




Figure: % MLAs with pending criminal cases

Party wise break up for MLAs with serious pending criminal cases

The table below gives summary of all serious violent offences related to murder, kidnapping, extortion, theft, robbery and Dacoity of winning parties. All serious IPC's have been clubbed under four heads namely- violent crimes; robbery, extortion, theft etc; financial frauds and other serious crimes. As can be seen from the table MLAs of INC have 34 pending serious criminal IPC counts against them. For BJP MLAs the figure is 29 and for BJD it is 77.

Out of 1288 candidates who contested in Odisha Assembly 2009, 93 (7%) were crorepatis. INC had 16% crorepati candidates, whereas BJD had 22% crorepati candidates.




Figure: Crorepati candidates from major parties




Figure: Average assets for candidates-party wise

On the other hand, only 5% of candidates with assets less than Rs 10 lakhs won. The election results seemed to be highly influenced by the money power of the candidates




Figure: Comparison average assets for candidates &MLAs in Assembly 2009








Figure: Asset position in constituency among candidates and MLAs

Analysis of the first list of Cabinet of Ministers:

Odisha Election Watch (OEW) analyzed affidavits of all of 20 cabinet ministers. There are pending criminal cases against 3 ministers in the first list of Council of Ministers in Odisha Assembly 2009. The ministers who have declared that they have pending criminal cases against them are-

- 1) Bijay Ranjan Singh Bariha (Cabinet Minister)
- 2) Sarada Prasad Nayak (Cabinet Minister)
- 3) Anang Uday Singh Deo (Minister of State)

Bijay Ranjan Singh Bariha (BJD) has declared that there are 11 pending criminal cases against him. Sarada Prasad Nayak has declared 6 pending criminal cases & Anang Uday Singh Deo has declared 1 pending criminal case against him.

Background on Association for Democratic reforms (ADR) and National Election Watch (NEW)

About ADR & NEW

Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) was established in August 1999 by a group of Professors from the Indian Institute of Management (IIM), Ahmedabad. It started by filing a PIL in Delhi High Court in 1999 asking for disclosure of criminal, financial and educational background of candidates contesting elections. Based on this, Supreme Court in 2002 and subsequently in 2003, made disclosure of criminal, financial and educational background mandatory for candidates contesting Parliament and State Legislature elections, prior to the polls by filing an affidavit with the Election Commission.

The **National Election Watch** (NEW) is a nationwide campaign comprising of more than 1200 NGOs and other citizen led organizations working together on electoral reforms, improving democracy and governance in India. The National Election Watch is active in almost all states of India and has done election watch for all states and Lok Sabha elections to enable voters to make informed choice during elections.

Brief background

Early 1999: 11 IIM-Ahmedabad professors get together to form Association for Democratic Reforms

to work on electoral reforms.

August 1999: ADR files PIL in Delhi High Court seeking disclosure of pending criminal cases by

candidates contesting elections to parliament and state assemblies.

November 02, 2000: Delhi High Court upholds above PIL.

December 2000: Government of India appeals to Supreme Court against judgment of Delhi High Court.

May 02, 2002: Supreme Court rejects the appeal and upholds the High Court judgment.

June 28, 2002: Election Commission issues orders to implement the Supreme Court judgment.

July 08, 2002: All party meeting decides to amend Representation of People Act to prevent/dilute the

Supreme Court's orders.

August 22, 2002: Cabinet sends Ordinance for amending the Representation of People Act, to President

August 23, 2002: President returns the Ordinance.

August 24, 2002: Cabinet sends the Ordinance to the President a second time, the President signs, in

keeping with the convention.





October 2002: PILs filed in Supreme Court, including one by ADR, challenging the constitutional validity

of the amendment to the Representation of People Act, done by above Ordinance.

March 13, 2003: Supreme Court declares above amendment of the Representation of People Act as

"illegal, null and void" and restores its May 02, 2002 judgment.

March 27, 2003: Election Commission issues orders implementing the Supreme Court judgment.

2002-till date: First ADR, and now National Election Watch, conducts Election Watches in all Parliament

and State Assembly elections, collecting copies of affidavits filed by candidates, and

collating and summarizing the information given by candidate under oath.

Data available for over 50,000 candidates, self-declared by the candidates themselves under the Supreme Court order

2007: Files RTI applications before Election Commission and the Tax authorities seeking

information whether Political Parties file their contribution reports as per Sec 29(A) of RPA (Representation of Peoples' Act) 1951 to get tax benefits under Sec 13A of Income

Tax Act, 1961

21 Jun 2007: EC response contains details on 21 parties's contribution report. Many parties are listed

for not submitting the reports ever. Tax Authorities refuse to divulge the information

2008: CIC on 2nd appeal allows tax returns of political parties to be made public and directs the

authorities to furnish copies of the IT returns of the parties to public

2008: Scrutiny of copies of the return reveals that all the parties have availed benefit under

Sec 13 A of the Income Tax Act, even those who have not filed their statutorily

mandated contribution reports before Election Commission.

2008: Files a PIL in Supreme Court to issue order to conduct an inquiry to examine all

defaulting parties whom have been given benefit of section 13A of Income Tax Act and to take appropriate action against the defaulting political parties to recover the income

tax due from them from the date of default till date

Nov, 14 2008: Supreme Court sets the PIL aside

Jan 2009: Discussion with network partners to strategize on next steps.

May 2009: Results of Lok Sabha Election Watch shows that majority of candidates with heinous

criminal records lost elections.

Nov 2009: First ever report on election expenses released by ADR and NEW.





Our few achievements

- ADR won two milestone judgments on disclosure of candidate's criminal and financial records from the Supreme
 Court in May 2002 and March 2003 respectively. Since then, 1200 NGOs from all over the country are
 supporting ADR and ADR in partnership with its partners has organized Citizen Election Watch for all major
 elections and disclosed candidate's background information to the media and the public.
- After the Supreme Court's order, Members of Parliament (MPs) lined up to clear their outstanding dues to the Government for rent, electricity, phone bills and so on to avoid embarrassing disclosures while filing nomination papers.
- The Election Commission has completed a massive exercise based on the Gujarat Election Watch report to verify
 information filed by candidates in the nomination papers and affidavits, and has started proceedings against
 candidates with false declarations. They are now currently doing that for the subsequent elections as well.
- A Bill on Electoral Expenses passed in September 2003. The EC has taken it one-step forward and asked
 candidates to file a statement of expenses in every three days during the campaign. The EC has also made this
 information (in addition to the affidavits filed by candidates disclosing financial, criminal and educational
 background) available to citizens on request to Returning Officers, District Election Officers and the CEOs.
- Civil Society non-partisan Election Watches are springing up in different states. In the Lok Sabha 2004 Elections, 19 States and 5 Union Territories carried out Election Watches. In the Lok Sabha 2009 elections, Election Watches were held in all states and union territories in the country.
- Bihar Election Watch in October-November 2005 resulted in intense pressure on the Chief Minister Designate due to the extensive media coverage of candidate background. As a result, for the first time, Bihar has a Council of Ministers without any known criminal record.
- A national level political leader contacted ADR during the UP Election Watch in 2007 and wanted the list of candidates for his party with criminal details. Similarly, this also happened in the Karnataka Assembly Elections 2008.
- The Election Commission inaugurated Civil Society led National Conferences on Electoral Reforms in Ahmadabad, Bangalore, Patna, Lucknow and Mumbai. These Conferences were action oriented and resulted in successful Election Watch campaigns. The Election Commission has backed this work and the Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) has attended each year's Annual National Conference on Electoral and Political Reforms.
- The EC issued several very significant orders in the last one or two years relating to candidate disclosure, enforcing those affidavits are complete, taking action against false affidavits based on complaints, and disclosing electoral expenses.





- In April 2008, ADR obtained a landmark ruling from the Central Information Commission (CIC) saying that Income Tax Returns of Political Parties would now be available in the public domain along with the assessment orders.
- In the Karnataka Assembly Elections, 2008, there was a reduction in the number of candidates with serious offenses put by parties. There were 93 such cases against candidates in the 2008 elections, down from 217 in the 2004 assembly elections.
- Overall, the percentage of candidates with pending criminal cases came down from 20% to 14% in the assembly elections held in the country in 2008 for the states of Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, NCT of Delhi and Mizoram.
- Mr. L.K. Advani, Leader of the BJP gave a press statement that the BJP would not filed candidates with criminal records (October 2008). Mr. Rahul Gandhi, General Secretary of the Indian National Congress (INC), made similar announcement.
- A large number of candidates with serious pending cases that contested Lok Sabha 2009 elections like Pappu Yadav, Atiq Ahmed, Mukhtar Ansari, Akhilesh Singh, etc. lost.
- The number of total serious IPC sections against MPs decrease from 296 in Lok Sabha 2004 to 274 in Lok Sabha 2009.
- On Jan 25, 2010 both the Congress Chief Ms Sonia Gandhi and leader of opposition in Lok Sabha Ms Sushma Swaraj of BJP made public statements calling for a consensus on barring candidates with criminal backgrounds from contesting elections.
- On Feb 3, 2010 Prime Minister Manmohan Singh asks his Cabinet colleagues to disclose details of their assets and liabilities and refrain from dealing with the government on immovable property.
