



Press Release: MLAs and MPs of Jharkhand with Declared Criminal Cases against themselves

Date: 21st Dec, 2017

Ranchi: The Supreme Court on 1st Nov, 2017 had pointed out the increasing criminalization in politics while directing the Centre to come up with a scheme to set-up special fast-track courts that would deal exclusively with the criminal cases pending against Legislators and Parliamentarians.

Based on the information available with Jharkhand Election Watch on sitting MLAs of the Jharkhand Assembly, it is seen that out of 81 MLAs whose affidavits were analysed by ADR, 52 MLAs or 64% of the total MLAs had declared pending criminal cases against themselves at the time of contesting in elections held in 2014. Out of these, 41 had declared serious criminal cases and form or 51% of the total number of sitting MLAs. Among the political parties, BJP has the maximum number of MLAs with criminal cases (22) followed by JMM, with 13 MLAs and JVM(P) with 5 MLAs.

The status of **Lok Sabha MPs from Jharkhand** with declared criminal cases against themselves is also **not very encouraging**. **Out of 12 BJP MPs from Jharkhand** whose affidavits were analysed by ADR, **4** (33% of total MPs from Jharkhand) have declared cases against themselves of which **2** or **17%** have serious criminal cases pending against themselves.

The Upper House of the Parliament or the Rajya Sabha too is not immune from MPs from Jharkhand with declared criminal cases. Out of 6 Rajya Sabha MPs from Jharkhand whose affidavits were analysed by ADR, 1 has declared criminal cases against himself. Thus 17% of the total Rajya Sabha MPs from Jharkhand have declared criminal cases against themselves. It is to be noted that none of the Rajya Sabha MPs from Jharkhand has declared serious offences.

It is to be noted here that all the major political parties have winners with declared criminal cases.

Criminalisation of politics continues to remain a major concern in India as several sitting MPs and MLAs facing charges of corruption and serious offences such as murder, rape and kidnapping continue to be lawmakers. It is thus hoped that the Centre follows through with the proposed scheme of setting up 12 special courts for a year to fast-track criminal cases against sitting Legislators and Parliamentarians.
