# **Tripura 2008 Assembly Elections**

Tripura 2008 Assembly Elections was held on Feburary, 2008. A total of 312 candidates contested in Tripura Assembly Elections. This report includes the analysis of criminal, financial, educational and other details of 60 newly elected MLAs. Information provided by the Election Commission of India and CEO Tripura and details from the affidavits filed by the candidates have been used for the analysis.

## **Representation of political parties**

A total of 312 candidates contested the Tripura 2008 Assembly Elections representing 14 parties. In 2003, 254 candidates contested representing 13 parties for Tripura Assembly Elections. This reflects an increase of 19% in the number of candidates contesting election from Tripura 2003 Assembly Elections to Tripura 2008 Assembly Elections. The numbers of parties all though were almost the same.

A total of 312 candidates contested in Tripura 2008 Assembly Elections representing 14 parties. Out of these, only 2 parties (i.e. CPM and INC) managed to reserve places in 2008 Tripura Assembly.





# **Executive summary of candidates and MLAs**

## **Summary of Candidates**

- Tripura Election Watch (TEW) has analyzed affidavits of 304 candidates out of 312 candidates who contested in 2008 Assembly Elections.
- Out of these 304 candidates analyzed, 7 candidates (2 %) have declared criminal cases against them. INC has 2 out of 48 (4%), INPT has 1 out of 10 (10%), and 4 out of 61 (7%) IND candidates analyzed have declared criminal cases.
- Among major parties, out of these 7 candidates with declared criminal cases, 4 have declared serious criminal cases like rape, murder, Voluntarily causing grievous hurt by dangerous weapons or means, Kidnapping for ransom, theft etc against them. INC has 1; INPT has 1 and IND has 2.
- Among these 7 candidates who have declared criminal cases against themselves, Santi Kumar Debbarma, an independent from Golaghati constituences has declared 1 case including 1 charge related to murder. He is followed by Birajit Sinha of INC from Kailasahar constituency with 1 charge related to murder and Rabindra Debbarma of INPT from Simna constituency with 1 charge related to rape.
- A total of 6 candidates out of 304 analyzed (2%) are crorepati.
- The candidate who has declared maximum assets is Bibhu Kumari Devi of INC from Matarbari with assets worth Rs. 6.57 crores. She is followed by Subal Bhomik of INC from Sonamura with assets worth Rs. 3.01 crores and Dilip Sarkar of INC from Badharghat with assets worth Rs. 2.54 crores.
- A total of 27 candidates out of 304 analyzed have declared zero assets.
- A total of 5 candidates out of 304 analyzed, declared liabilities above Rs. 10 lakhs.
- Among major parties, the average asset per candidate for INC is Rs 61.04 lac, for INPT it is Rs 12.80 lac and for IND it is Rs 2.58 lac.
- Out of 304 candidates analyzed, 281(92.4%) have not declared their PAN details.
- 97 out of 304 candidates analyzed i.e. 32% are graduates or with higher educational qualifications.
- Out of 312 contesting candidates for Tripura Assembly Elections 2008, only 27 (9%) candidates are women; whereas in 2003 this number was 19 (7%) out of 254 contesting candidates

## Summary of MLAs

- Affidavits of all 60 MLAs have been analyzed by Tripura Election Watch (TEW). Including MLAs elected in bye elections of 2009 and 2012.
- Out of 60 MLAs analyzed, 2 (3%) have declared criminal cases against them.
- Among major parties, a total of 2 MLAs declared criminal cases in Tripura 2008 Assembly, both MLAs are from INC.
- Among these 2 MLAs who have declared criminal cases against themselves, Birajit Sinha of INC from Kailasahar constituency with 1 case including 1 charge related to murder. He is followed by Ratan Lal Nath of INC from Mohanpur constituency with 1 charge related to defamation.
- A total of 3 MLAs out of the 60 analyzed (5%) are crorepati.
- The MLA who has declared maximum assets is Subal Bhowik of INC from Sonamura with assets worth Rs. 3.01 crores. He is followed by Dilip Sarkar of INC from Badharghat with assets worth Rs.2.54 crores and Birajit Sinha of INC from Kailasahar with assets worth Rs. 1.57 crores.
- A total of 13 MLAs out of 60 analyzed have declared assets less than Rs.5 lac.
- A total of 22 MLAs out of 60 analyzed declared liabilities above Rs. 5 lac.
- Average asset for a MLA from Tripura is Rs 31.43 lacs. Among major parties, the average asset per MLA for INC is Rs. 1.04 crore, for CPM is Rs 16.26 lacs, and for RSP is Rs.9.96 lac.
- Out of 60 MLAs analyzed, 50(83.3%) have not declared their PAN details.
- A total of 30 (50%) MLAs (out of 60 analyzed) in Tripura 2008 Assembly Election are graduate and above.
- Out of 27 women candidates contested, only 3 won. Hence only 5% of MLAs in current Tripura Assembly are women. In 2003, 2 women won out of total 19 women candidates i.e. only 3% of MLAs in Tripura State Assembly 2003 were women.





## Analysis based on declared criminal cases- candidates

A total of 304 affidavits have been analyzed by Tripura Election Watch (TEW) for the 2008 Assembly Elections. Out of these 304 analyzed candidates, 7 (2%) declared that they have criminal cases against them. Out of these 7 candidates with criminal cases, 4 have declared serious criminal cases like rape, murder, Voluntarily causing grievous hurt by dangerous weapons or means, Kidnapping for ransom, theft etc against them.

TEW has analysed affidavits of all 60 MLAs. 2 MLAs out of these 60 MLAs from Tripura Assembly, 2008 have declared criminal cases against them. Of these 2 MLAs, one has declared serious criminal cases against him.




Figure : Percentage of candidates given PAN or not



All information about candidates, MLAs and Ministers in this report has been taken from the affidavits filed by candidates with their nomination papers. Copies of affidavits were obtained from the Election Commission (Website <u>http://eci.nic.in</u>) and Tripura CEO (Website http://ceotripura.nic.in). While all efforts have been made to ensure that the information is in keeping with what is mentioned in the affidavits, in case of discrepancy between information in this report and that given in the affidavits, the information reported in the affidavits filed by candidates should be treated as correct. # Background on Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) and National Election Watch (NEW)

## About ADR & NEW

Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) was established in 1999 by group of professors from Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Ahmedabad. In 1999, a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) was filed by them with Delhi High Court asking the disclosure of criminal, financial and educational background of the candidates contesting elections. Based on this, the Supreme Court in 2002 and subsequently in 2003, made it mandatory for all candidates contesting elections to disclose Criminal, Financial and educational background prior to the polls by filing an affidavit with Election Commission.

The first election watch was conducted by ADR in 2002 for Gujrat Assembly Elections whereby detailed analysis of the backgrounds of candidates contesting elections was provided to the electorate in order to help the electorate make an informed choice during polls. Since then ADR has conducted Election Watches for almost all state and parliament elections in collaboration with the National Election Watch. It conducts multiple projects aimed at increasing transparency and accountability in the political and electoral system of the country.

## **Our Achievements**

- ADR won the NASSCOM award for ICT led Innovation by Multi-stakeholder Partnerships. This award was for the Election Watch software of ADR and Webrosoft.
- ADR won two milestone judgments on disclosure of candidate's criminal and financial records from the Supreme Court in May 2002 and March 2003 respectively. Since then, 1200 NGOs from all over the country are supporting ADR and ADR in partnership with its partners has organized Citizen Election Watch for all major elections and disclosed candidate's background information to the media and the public.
- The Election Commission has completed a massive exercise based on the Gujarat Election Watch report to verify information filed by candidates in the nomination papers and affidavits, and has started proceedings against candidates with false declarations.
- A Bill on Electoral Expenses was passed in September 2003. The EC has asked candidates to file a statement of expenses in every three days during the campaign. This information is made available to citizens on request to Returning Officers, District Election Officers and the CEOs.
- Civil Society non-partisan Election Watches are springing up in different states. In the Lok Sabha 2004 Elections, 19 States and 5 Union Territories carried out Election Watches. In the Lok Sabha 2009 elections, Election Watches were held in all states and union territories in the country.





- Bihar Election Watch in October-November 2005 resulted in intense pressure on the Chief Minister designate due to the extensive media coverage of candidate's background. As a result, for the first time, Bihar has a Council of Ministers without any known criminal record.
- The Election Commission inaugurated Civil Society led National Conferences on Electoral Reforms in Ahmedabad, Banglore, Patna, Lucknow, Mumbai, Bhopal and Chennai. These Conferences were action oriented and resulted in successful Election Watch campaigns.
- The EC issued several very significant orders in the last two years relating to candidate disclosure, ensuring those affidavits are complete, taking action against false affidavits based on complaints, and disclosing electoral expenses.
- In April 2008, ADR obtained a landmark ruling from the Central Information Commission (CIC) saying that Income Tax Returns of Political Parties would now be available in the public domain along with the assessment orders.
- In the Karnataka Assembly Elections, 2008, there was a reduction in the number of candidates with serious offenses put up by parties. There were 93 such cases against candidates in the 2008 elections, down from 217 in the 2004 assembly elections.
- Overall, the percentage of candidates with declared criminal cases came down from 20% to 14% in the assembly elections held in the country in 2008 for the states of Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, NCT of Delhi and Mizoram.
- A large number of candidates with serious declared cases that contested Lok Sabha 2009 elections like Pappu Yadav, Atiq Ahmed, Mukhtar Ansari, Akhilesh Singh, etc. lost.
- The number of total serious IPC sections against MPs decrease from 296 in Lok Sabha 2004 to 274 in Lok Sabha 2009.
- On Jan 25, 2010 both the Congress Chief Ms Sonia Gandhi and leader of opposition in Lok Sabha Ms Sushma Swaraj of BJP made public statements calling for a consensus on barring candidates with criminal backgrounds from contesting elections.
- On Feb 3, 2010 Prime Minister Manmohan Singh asked his Cabinet colleagues to disclose details of their assets and liabilities and refrain from dealing with the government on immovable property.
- Because of an RTI application that ADR has been following up with the CIC for nearly the past 2 years, the contribution reports of major political parties have been made public. Added to this is the fact that the Election Commission has taken proactive steps towards bringing in some level of accountability in the functioning of the political parties by getting the ICAI to develop reporting formats for political parties
- In May, 2010, the Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh, Ms. Mayawati had announced the expulsion of about 500 party leaders with criminal past.
- In January 2011, the Election Commission of India entrusted the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) with the task of developing accounting format for political parties.
- Details of the movable and immovable assets of 30 Bihar ministers, including that of CM Nitish Kumar, were uploaded on the government website in January, 2011. It is seen as a step aimed at ending corruption promised by the Chief Minister himself.
